

First of Transient Farm Workers Due Coming Week

The first of the transient farm laborers to be brought into Marion county this summer for field, orchard and cannery work, probably will move into the barracks buildings on the east side of Turner road at Salem airport next week, Guy N. Hickok, one of the directors of the Salem Agricultural Housing corporation, told the Chamber of Commerce directors Wednesday night.

Water extensions to the buildings have been made and remodeling is under way, he said. The first workers to arrive will be employed as cherry pickers.

The executive committee of the chamber board of directors was authorized to elect a successor to the late Ralph Campbell as a member of the housing corporation, but the entire board will elect his successor as a

chamber director. The housing corporation represents Salem business interests, the cannerymen and the producers.

Alumina Plant Work Continues

Associated Press dispatches from Washington Wednesday night brought information that the reconstruction finance corporation has approved sufficient funds for the Salem alumina plant to assure operation the remainder of this year.

Stress is to be placed on the manufacture of ammonium sulphate fertilizer, though the experimental test of alumina extraction from clay will continue. Alumina extraction has already been accomplished in a limited degree, and some change in machinery and processing methods may be necessary in the alumina operation.

The plant is making a strong bid to turn out a large part of the 50,000 or 75,000 tons of ammonium sulphate that UNRRA is demanding for use in foreign countries, and as a result of the RFC approval it is said the present capacity of 120 tons of the fertilizer per day will be increased to 250 or 300 tons.

Unionvale — Peppermint is thriving at the R. T. Kidd farm, where hoeing the crop is in progress. Alfalfa hay at the same farm is curing quite slowly because of the recent showers.

Sign Installation Meets Complications

The Chamber of Commerce is having trouble with a city ordinance about installation of a neon sign in front of the Liberty street building where the chamber has its headquarters. The sign, an attractive design, was to be installed under the marquee in front of the Bishop store, with an arrow pointing upstairs to the chamber quarters. It has been fully approved by the chamber directors. Then it was discovered that installation under the marquee would be in violation of a city ordinance relative to height of signs from sidewalk.

Spaghetti Dinner
Broadcast: June 15, 1946

1/4 cup condensed vegetable soup
1/2 cup Pet Milk
1/2 cup water
1 cup diced American cheese (1 1/2 lb.)

1/2 teaspoon salt
few grains pepper
3 cups cooked spaghetti or macaroni, drained
8 wieners (1/2 lb.)

Turn on oven; set at moderately slow (350° F.). Grease a qt. baking dish. Mix together soup, milk, water, cheese, salt and pepper. Stir and cook over boiling water until cheese is melted. Fold in spaghetti. Put into baking dish. Arrange wieners on top. Bake about 18 min., or until mixture is bubbly hot. Serves 4.
