

West Salem Budget Approved But Little Interest Shown

West Salem, June 19—Only slight interest was evidenced in the city's special election held yesterday to consider a fiscal budget in excess of the 6 percent limitation. But 51 taxpayers appeared at the polls to cast their votes. The budget providing \$51,560 for fiscal expenditures with \$30,175 of the total to be off-set by water revenue, utilities fees, tax refunds, building permits, etc., drew 48 ascending and three opposing votes. Of the \$21,385 to be raised by direct taxation \$8710 was outside the 6 percent limitation set by law.

General increase in the cost of labor and materials for maintaining streets, water systems, police department, etc., contributed mainly to the increase in anticipated budget expenditures. The budget also included a mill levy for the securing of fire protection, comparable to that of Salem, from the Salem Fire Department.

President Ray Manegor of the St. Paul Rodeo association has announced that this rodeo was recently placed among the top 25 wild west shows in the United States. It is the only western Oregon rodeo named in the classification and rates second only to the Pendleton round-up in the state.
