

Lt. Col. Patch In Regulars

Freenville, AAB, S.C.—Announcement was made by the Third air force headquarters here August 16 of the commissioning to the grade of a first lieutenant in the regular United States army of Lt. Col. Horace Wendall Patch.

Patch, attached to the 303rd AAF base unit at this air base, where he heads the movements and operations section of the A-3 section Third air force headquarters, spent 43 months on overseas duty. He was in Alaska for 20 months and in the China-Burma-India theater, where he was head of a combat operation section, for 20 months. He has the Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star with Cluster, and Air Medal with Cluster, and three combat theater ribbons.

Given his pilot's wings at Stockton field, Calif., March 14, 1941, Col. Patch attended command and general staff school, the AAF air intelligence school, AAF staff officers' course and AAF flying school.

Patch's wife is the former Helen R. Kestley of Salem, Ore. His mother is Mrs. Frances M. Patch of Canby, Ore.

Democrats Plan Portland Rally

Portland, Aug. 21—A big day for Oregon democrats is planned for Thursday, August 22, when county chairmen, vice chairmen and democrats generally from all sections of the state will gather at the Multnomah hotel in Portland for a conference dealing with the coming congressional and other campaigns.

Three national representatives of the democratic party will be in Oregon for the session. They are Richard Macy, executive vice chairman; Mrs. George Tillott, vice chairman of women's activities, and Sam O'Neal, publicity director of the democratic national committee. The visitors will spend their time conferring with party leaders and workers from all over the state.

A luncheon meeting is being planned by Mrs. Nancy Robinson at the hotel during Thursday's noon hour, and the three officials will have an opportunity to discuss campaign procedure.

Legion Seeking Open Rent Deal

Pointing out that many persons living outside the municipal boundaries of Salem would gain no benefit from a local rent control measure, Don Goode, commander of American Legion Post No. 126, Tuesday night asked that the situation here be kept open for OPA action if that step is deemed necessary. The post went on record as favoring inclusion in the proposed city rent control ordinance, a provision that OPA stabilization take over if the situation gets out of hand.

Sample Copies Furlough Form

A sample copy of the application form and instructions to enlisted men of World War II in applying for their unused terminal leave or furlough pay was received this week by the department of veterans' affairs, from Major Gen. G. B. Erskine, re-training and re-employment administrator.

An accompanying letter to Director George E. Sandy said that all community advisory centers and county veterans' service offices would receive the sample forms shortly.

Although postoffices will receive supplies soon for veterans, the sample form will enable service officers to study the instructions and be ready to help veterans make their applications when the time comes, Sandy said. Earlier doubt as to whether photostatic copies of discharges would be accepted as proof of military service was clarified as follows:

"We know you were glad to learn that the armed forces acted favorably on the recommendation that photostatic copies of discharge papers, as well as originals, will be accepted."

"Pass," "liberty," or periods of temporary duty are not chargeable as leave or furlough, nor are sick, convalescent, or rehabilitation leave, but "delay en route" will be, the instructions indicate.

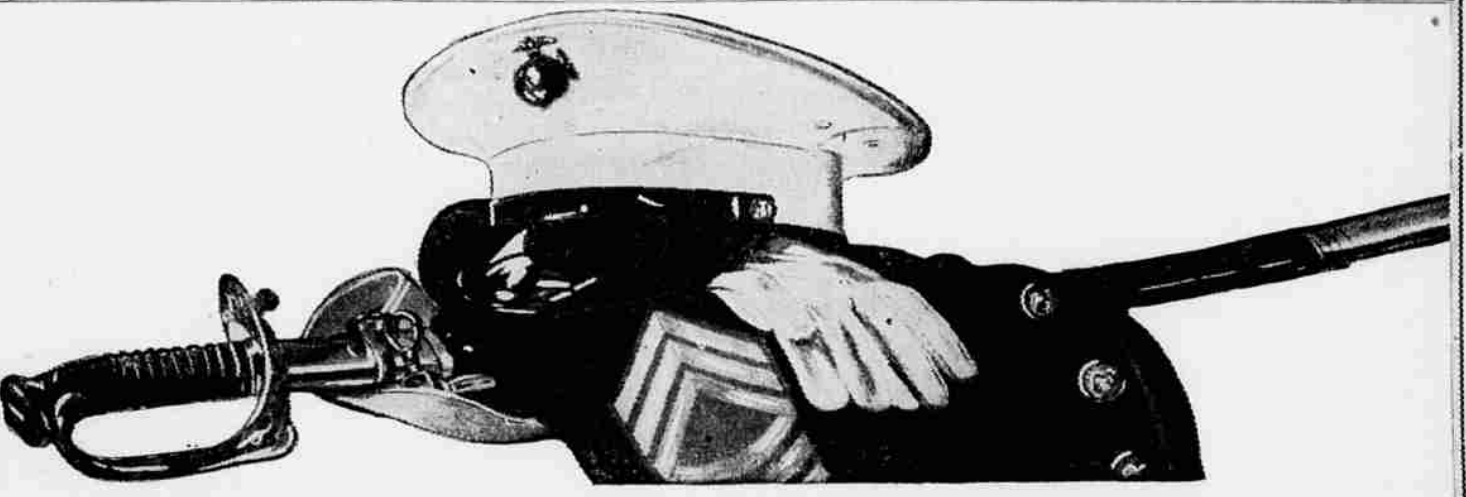
