

County's Tax Rate Is Higher

Dallas — Tax rates in Polk county will be higher this year than they have been for many years, according to Ed. C. Dunn, county assessor, whose office completed working out the millage levies this week.

Increased costs of operating the schools, due to higher teachers' salaries, larger enrollment and the teachers' retirement plan figure largely in the jump. Of 62 school districts in the county only seven voted a lower special school tax. Taxes even in the 7 districts, may not be lower as \$60,000 was voted for road district No. 1, which covers all districts outside of the cities.

Tax rate at Falls City is the highest in the county with a levy of 140 mills, nearly double the 76.9 of last year. Willamina's rate (that portion of which is in Polk county) is second highest at 129.1 mills, jumping from 79.9.

Higher costs of administering city governments is responsible for the increase in city taxes.
