

Proposed Dams Are Described

Portland, Oct. 21 (AP)—Details of the seven earth dams proposed for tributaries of the McKenzie and South Santiam rivers in the army engineers' flood control program were outlined today.

Col. O. E. Walsh, district engineer, reported the dams will range in height from 120 to 335 feet with storage capacities varying from 40,000 to 255,000 acre feet.

The largest will be the Peter Green dam on the Middle Santiam, seven miles east of Sweet Home. It will be 316 feet high and store 255,000 acre feet from a drainage area of 277 square miles. Cost is estimated at \$13,200,000. An additional 25 feet of height could enable production of 21,000 kilowatts of power.

The smallest will be the Jordan dam on Thomas creek, seven miles east of Scio. It will be 120 feet high of earth and gravel, storing 53,000 acre feet and costing \$1,900,000.

The Wiley creek dam, five miles southeast of Sweet Home, would be 205 feet high, storing 42,000 acre-feet from an area of 53 square miles and costing \$2,800,000.

Highest of the McKenzie area dams would be the 335 feet high Cougar creek dam six miles southeast of Blue river. Costing \$11,100,000, it would store 130,000 acre-feet from an area of 88 square miles.

Others would be the Simmonds creek dam on Blue river, 175 feet high, at \$3,800,000; Gate creek dam near Vida, 210 feet high, at \$3,300,000; Horse creek dam, 240 feet high, at \$8,800,000.

Colonel Walsh said public hearings will be held at Vida November 8 and Lebanon November 9.

Wheeler to Outline Basin Program

Portland, Oct. 21 (AP)—The army engineers' development program for the Columbia river basin will be outlined here Wednesday by Lt. Gen. Raymond A. Wheeler, army chief of engineers.

He will speak at opening sessions of the two-day convention of the Inland Empire Waterways' association.

Other speakers will be Dr. Wilson Compton, president of Washington State college.

Medford, Oct. 21 (AP)—AFL automobile mechanics idled since early July in their strike for a closed shop contract today indicated a "general labor holiday" may be called in the area unless employers accept their demands.

WCAL to Build Station House

Portland, Oct. 21 (AP)—West Coast Air Lines reported today it would erect a station house at the Portland-Columbia airport before November 1 in preparation for inauguration of flights next month.

Eight flights a day will land at Portland from western Oregon and Washington terminal cities on the company's new routes. Ground crews will be stationed here and at Medford for service checks, with maintenance work to be done at the Seattle terminal.

The firm is authorized to operate Portland-Seattle flights on two routes: Portland, Chehalis-Centralia, Olympia, Tacoma, Seattle; Portland, Astoria, Aberdeen-Hoquiam, Olympia and Seattle. The Oregon routes are authorized from Portland, McMinnville, Albany-Corvallis, Eugene, Coos Bay-North Bend, Roseburg, Grants Pass and Medford. The Grants Pass area will not be served until airport improvements are made.

Dave Martin, public relations director, reported the starting of full service has been delayed by lack of equipment. The firm has 25 DC-3 24-passenger craft on order, but has received only one.

Former Grange Editor Passes

Roseburg, Oct. 21 (AP)—Dr. C. H. Bailey, 78, former editor of the Oregon Grange Bulletin and widely known for his activity in agriculture, died in the hospital here Saturday night.

Dr. Bailey, a native of New York state and educated in Michigan, moved to Oregon in 1908 after practicing dentistry in Detroit from 1897. He purchased a farm on South Deer Creek eight miles east of Roseburg and later pioneered in growing broccoli and other crops in Douglas county. He served as county fruit inspector for many years and sponsored organization of several farm cooperatives.

He was president of the Oregon State Horticultural society in 1916 and 1917. The widow, a son, William H. Bailey, and one grandson, all of Roseburg, survive. Funeral services will be held tomorrow.

Building Steel Homes Portland Project

Portland, Oct. 21 (AP)—Allocation of steel by the national housing expediter's office will launch construction of steel homes here at the rate of 100 to 200 a month in a portion of a war-built shipyard plant, Insulated Steel Homes, Inc., reported today.

D. H. Joyce, one of the company organizers, said the six-room units to sell at \$8,000 to \$8,500 erected on the owner's lot would be fabricated at the Gunderson Bros., plant.

On the site erection can be completed in five to seven days after laying of a concrete slab, Joyce said. Chimney and fireplace openings could be cut into the steel "stressed skin" type walls by torch after erection.

The first will be completed within 10 days after receiving the steel allocation from Washington, D.C., Joyce reported.

Extradition Up For Decision

Caldwell, Idaho, Oct. 21 (AP)—Whether or not Mrs. Gladys Lincoln Broadhurst, 40, will fight extradition to Vale, Ore., where she and her chauffeur, Albert Lee Williams, 23, are jointly charged with the murder of her husband, was to be decided today.

The woman, whose wealthy rancher-husband, W. D. Broadhurst, 51, was found slugged and shot on a desolate road between his Caldwell dairy farm and his Jordan Valley, Ore., cattle ranch, conferred in jail here with her attorney.

At Vale, District Attorney E. Otis Smith said Williams admitted the slaying in the presence of several officers but the prosecutor refused to speculate on the motive of the crime.

Broadhurst's body was found last Thursday, four days after he was reported missing. The couple, who were married five months ago at Reno, Nev., first met 20 years ago while attending Albion, Idaho, Normal school.

Both Williams and Mrs. Broadhurst will be tried in January, Smith said.
