

### President Looks at Juvenile Delinquency

Washington, Nov. 21—(UP)—President Truman Wednesday told a national conference for the prevention and control of juvenile delinquency that he would support any plan it may offer to alleviate "this blight upon our country."

"It is my belief that your efforts will result in a sincere campaign to keep our children and young people from swerv-

ing towards the paths of crime," Mr. Truman said in a message to 1,000 delegates at the opening session of the conference. It was read on his behalf by Supreme Court Justice Harold H. Burton, temporary chairman.

The three-day conference was attended by representatives of federal, state, local and private organizations as well as 11 representatives of the United Nations.

Washington, Nov. 21—(AP)—The National Housing Agency today has made a tentative allotment of \$275,000 toward repair of the Milwaukie-Estacada highway in Clackamas county, Ore.

road open throughout the winter.

**Mary Lee Taylor's**  
Pumpkin Pie  
Broadcast: November 23, 1946

1/2 cup light brown sugar  
2 teaspoons flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon ginger

1 cup cooked or canned pumpkin  
1 cup Pet Milk  
1 slightly beaten egg yolk  
4 teaspoons dark molasses

Turn on oven; set at very hot (450° F.). Mix together brown sugar, flour, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger and cloves. Add pumpkin, milk, beaten egg yolk and molasses. Stir until smooth. Pour into deep 7-in. pie pan lined with unbaked pastry. Bake 15 min., then reduce heat to slow (325° F.) and bake 25 min. or until firm. Note: 1 1/2 tablesp. ground allspice or prepared pumpkin pie spice can replace cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger and cloves.

For Sweet Potato Pie, substitute for the pumpkin freshly cooked or canned sweet potatoes or yams, put through a sieve; reduce brown sugar to 1/2 cup, omit molasses and add 4 tablesp. melted butter or margarine. For Squash Pie, follow recipe for Pumpkin Pie, substituting cooked winter squash, thoroughly mashed, for the pumpkin. To cook squash, cut in pieces, remove seeds, and steam 45 min., or until tender.
