

Fire Hazards Alarm Albany

Albany—Although Albany's fire losses have been relatively low in recent years the business district is a veritable tinder box and as community growth stimulates business activities the Albany fire department is tightening down in inspection policies. Fire Chief Don Hayne said Thursday.

Chief Hayne's warning was prompted by the current epidemic of disastrous fires elsewhere but he said the local department had begun some time ago to impose greater restrictions on fire hazards such as the accumulation of refuse and arrangement of heating facilities in the downtown area.

Chief Hayne said many of the downtown structures are of frame construction and are antiquated, with spaces between them which would greatly accelerate progress of flames should a conflagration be started.

Stayton Sleep Less Disturbed

Stayton—Residents of Stayton are getting accustomed to the quiet, peaceful nights that are no longer disturbed by the thunderous noises which have rent the air whenever a car crossed the bridges on First street over the ditches.

The one over the Salem ditch was completed last month, and the one over the Gardner ditch was thrown open to traffic Wednesday and the men are now busy dismantling the temporary bridge over which traffic was routed.

Having a concrete head wall, the bridge is 115 feet in length and 22 feet wide. Cross decking of 4 by 12s was laid, with 2 by 2 decking running lengthwise. An asphalt sealer was spread between the two decks. Both bridges will be resurfaced as soon as dry weather is here.

A total of 26 days was spent in building the two bridges which were under the supervision of Ted Kuenzi, foreman. Work on the bridge over the North Santiam river will be postponed until May, when a defour bridge can be built. It is thought a period of three months will be required to complete the work.
