

Hope for 32 Marines Wanes

Seattle, Dec. 13 (AP)—Hopes waned today for the 32 marines aboard a marine corps transport plane when it disappeared Tuesday afternoon en route here from San Diego, Calif.

While official sources were silent, searchers, chafing under inactivity enforced by some of the worst storm conditions in a decade, expressed fears there can be no survivors of the missing plane.

They were based on Mount Rainier to begin a search of its slopes, particularly on Nisqually glacier, above the 8000-foot altitude as soon as the weather permits.

The plane last reported herself south of Toledo, Wash., at 4:13 p.m. (PST) Tuesday. Toledo is some 40 miles southwest of the mountain.

Search turned to Mt. Rainier after Park Supt. John C. Preston reported hearing a plane overhead about 4:15 p.m. Tuesday during a heavy downpour, and a ranger at Paradise Valley, near the glacier, also told of hearing the plane.

Preston said that if the plane struck the mountain, it would have been buried in the deep snow, and it may be some time before it can be located even after the weather clears.

The plane was one of six transferring marines to Seattle. The weather forced four to stop at Portland. A fifth made it safely to Seattle.

Cohn-Vidor Feud Aired

Los Angeles, Dec. 13 (AP)—Federal Judge Ben Harrison called a halt today on further listing of epithets which Harry Cohn, head of Columbia studios, has testified he used as terms of friendship for Charles Vidor, one of his top directors.

Observing that many of the terms, largely referring to ancestry, had already been disposed of, Judge Harrison remarked: "This vile and improper language has been admitted and it is no credit to him."

Hubert Morrow, attorney for Vidor in his suit to terminate his contract with Columbia on the ground that Cohn's treatment of him constituted cruelty, asked Cohn on cross-examination whether Vidor's agent ever had protested against his attitude.

Cohn said Bert Allenberg came to him and said, "lay off Charlie."

When Cohn repeated that he had called Vidor "A Hungarian..." Morrow wanted to know if any strong language had been used.

"Isn't that strong language?" Judge Harrison asked.

"There are some 23 varieties," Morrow replied. "We would like to know the others."

Arguments in the studio dining room were common occurrences, Cohn reiterated, and added:

"When Vidor became important in 'Cover Girl' he moved up the table near me."
