

Polk Polling Places Same

Dallas—Polling places in the eleven precincts or parts of precincts included in the proposed East Polk county People's Utility District will be the same for the special election of the district as they were for the general election in November, according to Edna M. Pitzer, county clerk.

The special election will be held from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. on February 6. Precincts included in the proposed district are part of second West Salem, part of McCoy, parts of Southeast and Southwest Monmouth, and all of the four Independence precincts, Rickreall, Buena Vista and Eola.

Registration for the election closes on January 6, the last day to register. Those who have not registered and are qualified to vote may sign up with registrars in the precincts or with the county clerk in Dallas.

The vote will be taken upon the order of the state hydro-electric commission after sponsors of the move had filed petitions with the commission. It will be decided whether the district shall be established and five of seven candidates for directors will be elected in the event that a majority favors the P.U.D. Those candidates for directors are Duane W. Griffith, Nelson Anderson, Charles Evans, Claude Larkin, Perry Wells, Merle M. Fulmer and Owen Lemmon.

Only one incorporated city, Independence, is included in the 97 square miles covered in the proposed district.

Ultimate Disposal City Dump Looming

Albany—Ultimate abandonment of the city dump in Hazelwood addition long a west-end sore spot, has been determined but the premises cannot be immediately eliminated and accordingly the city council renewed its lease of the site to the Albany Disposal company for a six-months' period ending June 30.

Then or soon after that date all city garbage and refuse will be disposed of on the new 62-acre site which the city has purchased two miles south and a mile west of Albany's southern city limits.

At the new site the sanitary

fill system will be employed, involving the bulldozing of trenches which will receive all refuse, and which will be filled in progressively. This site is designed to serve until such time as the city may build an incinerator.
