

### Advice Given on Over-Payments

Oregon offices of the veterans administration have received instructions that recovery of subsistence allowance over-payments from veterans in training under the GI bill should be made in a manner that will impose no hardship, Wayne F. Smith, VA training officer in this area, said today.

Any veteran whose subsistence has been suspended to balance prior over-payments, and who can show that undue hardship is resulting, should apply to the VA regional office for a readjustment, Mr. Smith advised.

The over-payments followed wage ceilings set by congress for veteran trainees last August 8. To avoid sudden mass suspensions, the VA continued full subsistence payments, pending receipt of monthly wage reports from the trainees.

Report forms sent to veterans contained the warning that any subsistence payments which put a trainee over the \$175 or \$200 income ceilings would be subject to recovery by the government. Many returned their over-payments voluntarily as they were received, but others chose to postpone the day of reckoning.

During December, 171 veterans in Oregon cleared up their over-payments with the VA. At month's end, 2095 cases of over-payments totaling \$151,702 were still outstanding, for which no recovery arrangements had been made. About 2000 trainees with over-payments are still drawing reduced subsistence.

### Coos Bay Chosen for KC 1947 Meeting

Coos Bay was selected as the 1947 convention city when Oregon state officers and district deputies of the Knights of Columbus met here Saturday. Fred Muhs of McMinnville was elected state secretary to fill the unexpired term of Lowell Dupray of Medford who has been appointed special field representative for northern California and is now living in Sacramento.

Reports of district deputies and officers show that the Oregon lodge is having one of the best years, with all councils assured of meeting their membership quotas.

The council had dinner at the Marion hotel and the sessions followed in the K of C club rooms. On Sunday a large class was initiated for Mt. Angel council under the direction of District Deputy Ed Stolle and State Deputy William J. LaRoche. The major degree was conferred by District Deputy Lee Goetz of Portland, assisted by Dr. F. A. Reiffing of Eugene.

### Furlough Rates to Continue in West

Naval personnel on leave in the western part of the United States still may purchase and travel on furlough tickets after January 30, 1947, the deadline for furlough rates on most eastern railroads.

The dividing line between

furlough and regular tariff rates has been set at Chicago and the Mississippi river, on the eastern side of which all railroads with the exception of four will demand the regular tariff, including 15 per cent tax. Exceptions are the Central of Georgia Railroad, the Gulf, Mobile & San Francisco, the St. Louis & San Francisco, and the Illinois Central. All of these roads have affiliations with the Trans-Continental Passenger association, which includes all western lines.

Decision to continue furlough rates in the west was prompted by a desire to allow military personnel the most inexpensive travel rate possible.

### Application for Building In

The Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company filed application with the district construction review committee of the civilian production administration in Portland Monday for the erection of a \$130,000 addition to its exchange building at 740 State street. When the building is completed it is planned to install \$300,000 worth of equipment.

The CPA approved the application of the Burkland Lumber company for the construction of a re-manufacturing plant at Turner to cost \$5600 and also of the T. T. Leonard rockwool plant at Dallas, \$4000.

Application of the International Business Machines corporation to spend \$3400 for remodeling a location at 156 South Commercial street was denied. The Washington office of the CPA denied the appeal of the Firestone Tire and Rubber company for an expansion to its repair shop at 395 North Liberty estimated to cost \$2200.

Floyd Bates was re-elected president of the Marion county Jersey Cattle club at its annual meeting this week with Bob Clark renamed vice president; O. C. Welch, secretary-treasurer, and Otto Beatty director. Mrs. Harley Nelson was selected chairman of the dinner committee and the Wayne Hilton place near Scotts Mills was selected as the next place of meeting.

The matter of headquarters at the state fair for Jersey men was discussed with varying ideas being expressed of a building for the Jersey breeders, quarters in the I-H club building or a building for all dairy breeders to include an auditorium, kitchen and office facilities. Kate Fair Manager Leo Spitzberg was present and urged all year use of the grounds and offered the suggestion that the Jersey breeders formulate plans along that line and a committee was named by President Bates to bring the matter before the meeting of the state Jersey club in Salem next Saturday. D. C. Brock, Harold Larsen and Lewis Judson were named on the committee.

Ted Hobart, field representative for the United States National bank, talked to the club on building for the future and reminded club members the bank is anxious to assist boys and girls with their dairy herds. Bill Poole, 4-H club member was given his award for his 1946 project and
