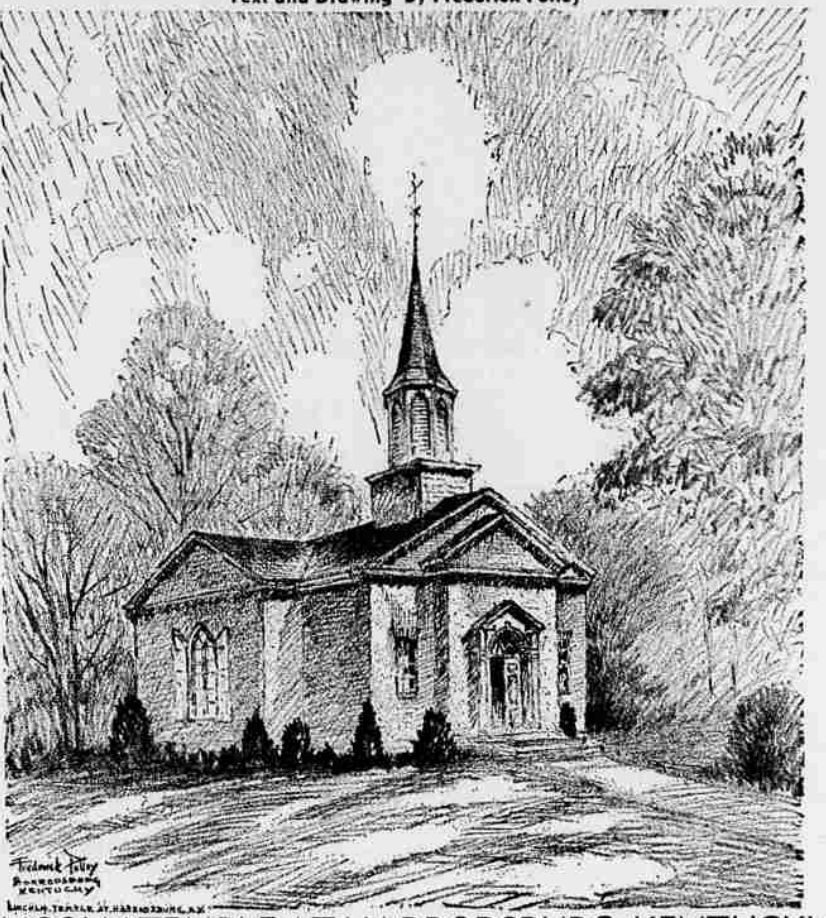

LINCOLN TEMPLE AT HARRODSBURG, KENTUCKY

This dignified, yet simple building, dedicated June 12, 1931, at Harrodsburg, Ky., enshrines the log cabin where Thomas Lincoln and Nancy Hanks were married June 12, 1806, by the Rev. Jesse Head. The marriage bond, signed by Thomas Lincoln and Richard Berry and witnessed by John H. Parrott, dated June 10, 1806, together with the minister's return of the records of the Washington county court at Springfield, Ky. The Rev. Jesse Head, who performed the marriage ceremony, lived in Harrodsburg and is buried there.

The cabin enclosed within this memorial was the first home of Thomas Lincoln and Nancy Hanks. It was known as the Richard Berry cabin and was located at Bechtland, Washington county, Kentucky. Richard Berry was the uncle and guardian of Nancy Hanks.

The cabin was presented in 1911 by its owners, Walter L. Clements of South Bend, Ind., and William A. Clements of Springfield, Ky., to the Harrodsburg Historical society.

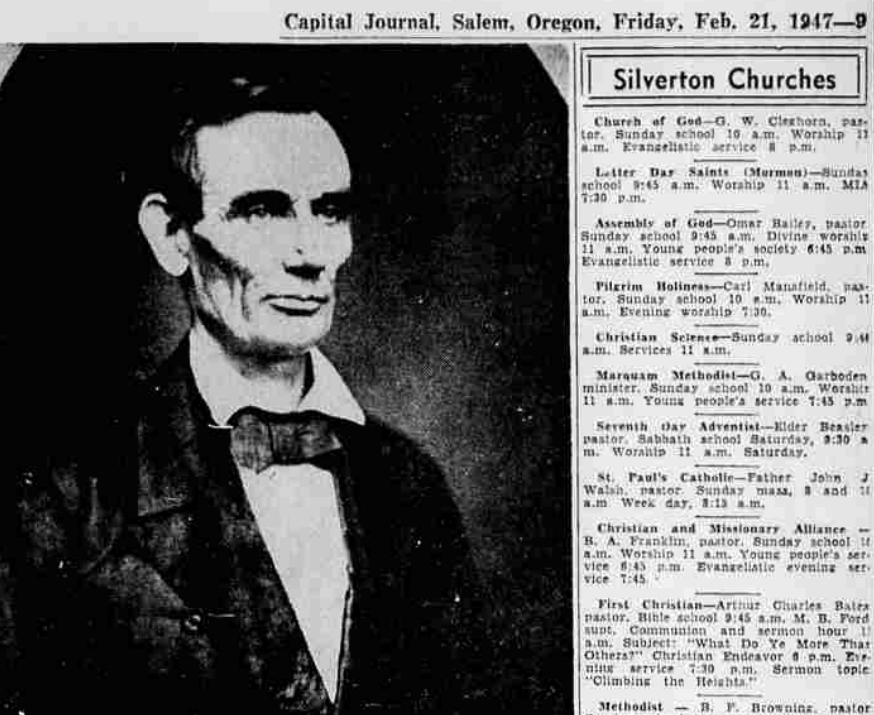

Salem Family Has Lincoln's Autographed Picture—In the possession of Floyd and Harley O. White of Salem is this picture of Abraham Lincoln, handed down from their grandfather who was a client of Lincoln when the latter was a lawyer at Springfield, Ill. Beneath the picture on the photograph, but not shown in the reproduction above, are the words in Lincoln's handwriting, "Yours, truly, A. Lincoln."

Gift Picture of Abraham Lincoln In Possession of Salem Brothers

An autographed portrait of Abraham Lincoln, made on glass to be viewed by reflected light as a transparency or projection slide, is a cherished possession of Floyd and Harley White, Salem secedmen, who inherited the heirloom from their grandfather, Pouncey Anderson White. Great interest was shown in the picture at the Lincoln birthday dinner under republican auspices last Wednesday night.

White was born on a plantation near Trenton, Kentucky, not far from Lincoln's boyhood home. Years later he conducted a business near Springfield, Ill., and here Lincoln served as White's attorney. Their friendship was close. It is presumed that Lincoln gave the autographed portrait to White about the time he emigrated into politics 90 or more years ago.
