Youths Adopt Beef Projects

Sixteen Marion County 4-H Club members have 29 calves on feed for beef projects this year, states Anthol Riney, county club agent.

All three breeds are represented with 24 Herefords, 3 Shorthorns and 2 Angus.

Riney just completed weighing all the calves with three exceptions and they shall be weighed again each month to give the members an accurate check on each steer's gain. The calves at present range in weight from 370 to 705 pounds. In order to make a good showing with these animals at Marion county 4-H fall show, state fair, or the Pacific International, some will have to gain from 2, 2½ or 3 pounds per day for the next 230 to 265 days.

Thirty-five registered Guernsey heifers have been selected from the best herds throughout the state of Oregon for the second 4-H club and FFA members heifer sale. They will be sold at auction March 20 at the fair grounds in Salem.

Last year's sale, sponsored by the Oregon Guernsey Breeders association, was so successful in placing high quality Guernsey heifers in the hands of 4-H club and FFA members, that they are going to repeat this year.

Only one or two of the best heifers from any herd were accepted. All are backed by the production records, breeding and type inheritance to make them particularly suitable as foundation animals.

Bidding at this sale will be limited to bona fide 4-H and FFA members. The junior sale program will go under way at 10:30 a. m., with a preview of the heifers and educational features. Sale will start at 1:00 p. m.

Hundreds of opportunities
 If you are 17 to 34, physically fit, and can pass certain mental examinations, you may enlist right now in the U. S. Air Force. Once in the Air Force you will have an opportunity to qualify for one of the many technical or specialized training courses offered by the Air Training Command. In addition, you may take courses under the United States Armed Forces Institute and complete your high school education. Then, if you are between 20½ and 28, you may compete for appointment to Officer Candidate School.

Special opportunities for high school graduates
 If you have graduated from high school you can enlist in the U. S. Air Force for 3 years and will be accepted for an Air Force Specialized School of your choice before you enlist, under the Aviation Career Plan. If you are between 20½ and 28 you can compete for appointment to Officer Candidate School. Single men between 20 and 26½ who have two years of college or can pass an equivalent examination may be eligible for Aviation Cadet Training.

Special opportunities for men with two years of college or the equivalent
 In addition to the opportunities offered by the Aviation Career Plan and Officer Candidate School, all unmarried male citizens between 20 and 26½ are eligible to apply for Aviation Cadet Pilot Training (next classes start March 1 and July 1). Successful graduates of pilot training will be rated as Air Force pilots, commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants, Air Force Reserve, and assigned to flying duty with the U. S. Air Force. These officers will have an opportunity to compete for a Regular Air Force commission. 2nd Lieutenants, unmarried, receive pay up to \$336 per month.

Special opportunities for Veterans of any of the Armed Forces
 If you held an occupational specialty in any of more than 800 skills with the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard, you may be eligible for a grade as high as Technical Sergeant in the Air Force, depending upon your skill and previous experience. Former officers may apply directly to Headquarters, U. S. Air Force, Washington 25, D. C., for a determination of a grade in which they may enlist.
