

GOP Supports Dixie Rebels

Washington, March 8 (AP)—The civil rights fight moved to the house floor today with the GOP leadership apparently ready to side with rebelling Dixie democrats.

An odd set of political circumstances finds the republicans risking a minor break in their own lines in an obvious effort to keep the fires of revolt ablaze in President Truman's party.

The showdown test shaped up over an anti-discrimination rider to the \$1,017,851,000 labor department-federal security appropriation bill up for debate today and a vote probably late tomorrow.

The issue is: Shall states that do not give equal educational and job opportunities to citizens of all races, when those opportunities are financed with federal funds, continue to receive the money?

An appropriations sub-committee which wrote the bill said they should not and tacked on the rider, or amendment, to that effect. But the full committee overrode the sub-group and by a 25 to 6 vote knocked the proviso from the bill.

Loggers Seek Strike Vote

Olympia, March 8 (AP)—The International Woodworkers of America (CIO) regional negotiating committee had a request today that it authorize a strike vote among the 40,000 CIO timber workers in Oregon and Washington.

The request was made by the executive board of the Boommen and Rafter District Council No. 11. It represents 600 men in southwest Washington.

The board conditioned its request to be effective "unless there is a satisfactory offer made" by employers' representatives that they intend to "enter into sincere and honest negotiations" when they meet with union representatives in Portland this Wednesday and Thursday.

The union seeks a general wage increase of 32 1/2 cents an hour, paid holidays, and a 7 1/2 cent a man hour payment into a health and welfare fund.

Films of Five Stars Banned by Czechs

Prague, March 8 (AP)—The films of five American stars have been banned in Czechoslovakia because of anti-communist testimony before the house committee on un-American activities last October.

Pictures starring Adolphe Menjou, Gary Cooper, Robert Montgomery, Robert Taylor and Ginger Rogers have been barred from screens here.

The government also banned a half dozen other films, including "Sergeant York."

A similar ban was imposed in Hungary on January 16.

A Russian film, "Salute to Moscow," is playing in two first rank theaters.

Romanian Envoy To London Resigns

London, March 8 (AP)—Bulgaria's minister to Britain has quit his job, in order, he says, "to work for the restoration of liberty and democracy in my country."

The minister, Nikola Dolapchiev, thus joined Vassil Youroukoff, Bulgarian minister to Belgium, who announced last Friday that he had resigned. The Bulgarian government said the next day Youroukoff had been dismissed.

In Sofia, Bulgarian newspapers announced today that Dolapchiev had been dismissed because of "his treacherous attitude toward Bulgaria."

De Valera Arrives in U. S.

New York, March 8 (AP)—American-born Eamon De Valera arrived by plane today for his first visit to this country in 18 years—in plenty of time to take part in St. Patrick's day celebrations.

After 16 years as prime minister of Eire, De Valera plans a tour of several large American cities until about April 6.

De Valera, who flew in from Shannon airport where 3,000 well-wishers saw him off, was met before dawn by an official party at La Guardia field.

He said he believes his nation "will co-operate with other countries as far as feasible with its present national situation."

Answering a newsman's question, he said "Everybody knows" the Irish people's opposition to communism.

De Valera was replaced as prime minister by John Costello at last month's elections.

He will fly to Tulsa, Okla., Thursday and on Friday to San Francisco.

He will act as grand marshal of the St. Patrick's day parade, which is held in San Francisco on March 14.

Fire Fighting Survey Starts

Independence—In an effort to increase the efficiency of its fire fighting organization officials of the Southeast Polk Rural fire protection district are launching a survey of the farms within the district.

According to Charles Ray of district board, every farm in the area will be assigned a number. This number will then be listed on a chart to be posted in the fire house here as well as at Monmouth where the district also maintains a pumper.

When this survey is completed, Ray explained, all that will be necessary in reporting fire will be to give the number of the farm without going into detailed instructions as to its location. This system, which is in effect in other rural fire protection districts, is expected to speed up response to alarms from the rural areas.

Ray said that his board plans to negotiate with the city of Independence for use of its street sweeper as a supplementary water supply in combating fires in the rural areas.

During the year 1947, Ray said, there have been 17 fires in this rural fire protection district which extends north to the Salem-Dallas highway and west to a point about two miles west of the Pacific highway.

The county farm bureau now has a total of 27 members. Speaker at the last meeting was Sandy McDonald, valley organizer, who explained the bureau's insurance program. Sam Hunt, state representative, outlined the history of the farm bureau in Oregon.

The election of regular officers, scheduled for last week, has been postponed until a later date.

Marion Farm Bureau Meets in Woodburn

Woodburn—The next regular meeting of the Marion County Farm Bureau will be held March 12 at Woodburn high school, according to Tom DeArmond, temporary chairman. A membership drive was conducted last week.

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PCA to Oppose Governor Hall

Portland, March 8 (AP)—Oregon's Progressive Citizens of America chapter will oppose Governor Hall's bid for election and has endorsed the third party bid of Henry Wallace.

Delegates at the week-end convention left to the board of directors any decision to sponsor petitions to put the Wallace-Taylor ticket on the state November ballot, or merge with other political groups in the elections.

Opposition to Governor Hall's gubernatorial candidacy came after Irvin Goodman, Portland attorney and a PCA director, criticized Hall's failure to commute the death sentence of Wardell Henderson, The Negro recently was executed.

Nels Peterson was re-elected chairman of the directors. Frank Patterson was re-elected vice chairman.

The convention, the first convocation of the Oregon chapter, also denounced the arrest of Gerhart Eisler, an alien once termed America's No. 1 communist by the house un-American activities committee. Eisler was released on bail Saturday from Ellis Island.

One crewman had been rescued late yesterday.

Lifeboats from the Fort Macdon and Cape Lookout coast guard stations brought the men to Fort Macdon.

Rescue efforts were abandoned because of darkness and heavy seas after the ship's electrician, who volunteered to be first, was swept from a rescue line and dashed under the keel of a coast guard boat. He was pulled aboard the boat and hospitalized with head injuries.

Two coast guardsmen also were injured in the rescue operations in the 18-foot waves.

Whipped by a 60-mile gale and shipping water, the Norfolk sought safe harbor here from the storm. The coast guard attempted late yesterday morning to put a pilot aboard, but the small boat took a terrific beating and one coast guardsman was hurt in the unsuccessful effort.

The vessel then apparently attempted to make the harbor without a pilot through the narrow inlet and hit the bar where she stuck fast.

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Girl Accused of Killing Parents

Eminence, Mo., March 8 (AP)—A 17-year-old brunette was held today on a charge of murder in the fatal shootings of her mother and father.

Betty Jane Kroeger signed a statement yesterday saying she shot her mother to death in their home Tuesday and killed her father in his store the following day. Highway Patrol Captain J. A. Tandy reported.

The bodies of Fred Kroeger, 50, and his wife, Minnie, 48, were found Saturday night.

The slender, dark-eyed brunette said her outlook of life changed when she left East St. Louis, where the family lived until 1944, and moved to the Ozarks. She said the change from gay city life to Ozark country life made her unhappy.

The girl told a newspaper reporter who interviewed her in jail that she shot her mother accidentally following an argument over the ironing of a dress.

Tandy quoted her as saying she then killed her father because she knew he would find out about the first slaying. She said she shot her father while he was asleep in his store, Tandy reported.
