Eugene Wins Suit for Land

The city of Eugene won a supreme court case today to condemn 51 acres of land for use in the city's power and water system.

The land is owned by Mr. and Mrs. A. West Johnson. They claimed that the city didn't need the land, and that the city wanted to pay only a tenth of what the land is worth.

The city offered \$2,500 for the land, and the Johnsons wanted \$27,795 for it.

The lower court of Circuit Judge G. F. Skipworth gave the city the land and fixed \$4,500 as the fair value.

Quake Brings Water To Desert Village

Shanghai, April 13 (AP)—A severe earthquake brought clear, cold water to a desert village which had been hauling its water 20 miles, reports reaching here said.

The recent quake leveled five flimsy buildings — but opened 12 deep fissures from which the water flows.

The village is Shayibark, in the remote Hotein district of Sinkiang province.

Read Appeals To High Court

Harry B. Read, manager of the Salem Electric Co-operative, has filed notice of appeal to the supreme court from a circuit court judgment finding him guilty of installing a wire over a public street without a franchise and contrary to the provisions of an ordinance of the city of Salem.

Read had taken appeal to the circuit court from a similar verdict in municipal court and Circuit Judge Page imposed a fine of \$150, the same as was imposed in municipal court. Read in his undertaking on appeal deposited \$350 in cash with the clerk and states he has deposited \$250 with the city court of Salem.

In proceedings before Judge Page no testimony was taken, the parties stipulating the facts. A bill of exceptions states that the defendant moved the court for dismissal on the ground no offense was charged, no violation of a valid city ordinance and that there was nothing before the court to indicate the violation of any valid ordinance and that the ordinance on which the action was based is unconstitutional and void.

It also charged that the action was discriminatory, that the operation of the ordinance was entirely discriminatory and that the city had granted an exclusive franchise to another corporation and refused to grant any consideration whatever to defendant Read.

Zionists Plan to Establish State

Jerusalem, April 13 (AP)—The Zionist general council intends to proclaim an independent Jewish state in the Holy Land May 16, the day after the British mandate ends.

The decision was made yesterday after an all-night session of the council at Tel Aviv. An internal authority may be set up which eventually would become the provisional government of the Jewish state.

Plan Pressure For America

After the conference of western governors in Sacramento April 20 the state executives will bring pressure on the congressional delegations of their states to demand relief from the ammonia shortage now hampering fertilizer production in the west.

This is the general plan of a committee that will appear before the governors, one of whom is Clay Cochran, manager of the Salem Chamber of Commerce.

Fertilizer plants in Salem, Salt Lake City and Oakland, Calif., need 6000 tons of ammonia monthly for making fertilizer. The army controls 40,000 tons monthly, all of which is going to Japan and the occupied countries of Europe.

In recognition of the demand from western farmers, seed growers and orchardists the committee wants a diversion of 6000 tons monthly for home use.

Deny Registrar In Labor Temple

A petition asking that a registrar for registering voters may be set up in quarters at the Labor Temple here filed with County Clerk Harlan Judd has been returned as not complying with provisions of the statute that such petition shall be signed by "not less than 25 resident taxpayers, a check indicating that there was an insufficient number of signers being resident taxpayers to qualify."

County Clerk Judd stated that he would have no objection to such a registrar being established there under petitions complying with the provisions of the law and also, if the petition stated such registrar would not ask for remuneration at the rate of 10 cents a voter registered outside of the county seat. The county clerk said that the law does not allow for such payments inside the county seat but does under certain conditions where registrars are set up outside of the county seat.

The law further provides that in event the county clerk denies such petition an appeal may be taken to the county court.

Explains Change Of Precinct Line

Complaint of Councilman David O'Hara lodged at Monday night's council meeting to the effect that the county court overstepped its statutory authority in making a recent precinct boundary change under which it took the Grant school block out of precinct No. 9 and put it into precinct No. 8 brought the retort from County Judge Grant Murphy that the court acted under a ruling of the attorney general and will allow the precinct change to stand unless forced by court action otherwise.
