**Norblad Files Lumber Protest**

Washington, April 29 (U.P.)—Rep. Walter Norblad (R-Ore), today protested "discrimination" against the west coast lumber purchases by France with American recovery money. Norblad asked Foreign Aid Chief G. Hoffman to "review" a decision under which he said France will spend \$1,600,000 in aid funds on lumber, \$1,000,000 of it in Canada and only \$600,000 in the United States. "I call to your attention the fact that pre-war (1931-1939) 92 percent of the lumber shipped from the Pacific coast to France came from Washington and Oregon, and about eight

percent from Canada," Norblad said. "It seems only just that as long as these purchases are being made from American taxpayers' funds, American lumber industry should be given a reasonable portion of this business." **Where's Your License?** More than 100,000 Oregonians are driving automobiles without driver's licenses, secretary of state Earl T.
