Co-op Sells Out to Private Company

Ontario, Ore., May 4 (AP)—Directors of the Malheur Co-operative association have approved sale of the electric utility to the Idaho Power company. Co-op President Harry B. Wilcox, Vale, reported the association had been operating at a loss. He said the deficit had accumulated to about \$100,977 and resulted in default to the government of about \$60,000 in principal and interest. He said the private Idaho firm has offered to pay \$473,000 for the co-op facilities in Malheur county, Ore., and Payette county, Idaho. Other obligations also will be assumed.

Eight Candidates Slated for Derby Trial Saturday

Louisville, Ky., May 4 (AP)—This Kentucky derby business really begins to warm up today with eight candidates for Saturday's \$100,000 jamboree squaring off in a race worth \$90,000 less—the derby trial. Several of the "leading men" in the world famous classic are slated for action in the one mile trial. It is the final test before Saturday's colorful show. Then some 100,000 turf customers will jam Churchill Downs to the limit and make Col. Matt J. Winn exceedingly happy that the thing got started 75 years ago.

The three big horses in this afternoon's race appear to be Fred W. Hooper's powerful combination of Olympia and Ocean Drive, and Greentree stable's ever-dangerous Capot. Each will carry 118 pounds.

Then there is the Calumet farm pair of DeLuxe and Ponder. If they belonged to other than Calumet and Canny Ben Jones, they probably wouldn't rate much consideration. But when Trainer Ben gets a horse ready for the derby, you just have to look twice, because of Calumet's great record in the last eight years. The rest of them in the trial, Mrs. H. J. Damm's Roundleer, Arthur P. Cotter's Petey Cotter, and Afton Villa farm's Jacks Town, could be in there just for the ride. Ponder, Roundleer and Jacks Town are in with 110, and Petey Cotter and DeLuxe have 112 each.

Washington Shows Hit Power in ChiSox Series

New York, May 4 (AP)—It just doesn't make sense, it's like Lefty Gomez trying to break Babe Ruth's home run record, but just the same it is true, the Washington Senators suddenly are the new slugging experts of the American league.

Hitting an all-time team high yesterday, the Senators shellshocked the White Sox at Chicago, 14 to 12, in 10 innings to amaze everybody who ever looked at a box score.

The Senators supposedly are the powder-puff batsmen of baseball. Traditionally, they hit fewer homers than any team in the majors. Last year they did not get their seventh homer for the season until June 8. And today they lead the American league with 15. A year ago they didn't get their 15th homer until July 30 when the season was more than half over.

With the score tied at 12 all, Washington clinched things in the 10th with the homers by Gil Coan and Al Evans. Chicago also got two homers, by Joe Tipton and Gus Zernial.

The Yankees, winning their 11th game in 14 starts, topped the Browns, 5 to 3, at St. Louis with an eight inning rally in which a double by Tommy Henrich and a single by Bobby Brown provided the winning edge.

The Red Sox and Tigers battled to a 13-inning, 14 to 14 tie in a slugging bee at Detroit called because of darkness. In the National, Riffin' Ralph Branca of Brooklyn became the first big league pitcher to win four games when he shut out the Reds, 3 to 0 on eight hits.

Walt (Monk) Dubiel of the Cubs pitched a five-hitter under the lights at Boston to beat the Braves, 4 to 0, and cut their league lead to a half-game.

Home runs by Willard Marshall, Sid Gordon, and Mickey Livingston, all of them off Murry Dickson, led the Giants to a 7 to 3 night win over the Pirates at New York.

The Phils got only five hits, but used three of them along with three walks and a hit batsman in the seventh inning to score six runs and beat the Cardinals, 7 to 3, at Philadelphia.

Seattle, May 4 (AP)—A three day synod of the Pacific province of the Episcopal church convened today at the St. Mark's cathedral with an impressive processional witnessed by visitors and delegates from seven western states. The opening service featured an address by the Rt. Rev. Sumner Walters, bishop of San Joaquin, Calif. The synod was the first in Seattle since 1937 and will be held in conjunction with the 27th annual meeting of the Provincial Women's auxiliary. Approximately 85 delegates from 12 dioceses and missionary districts will participate throughout the 30th annual sessions.
