Pair Jailed for Destroying Shrubs

Jail terms and a year's probation were ordered Wednesday in police court for two men found guilty of disorderly conduct as a result of destroying shrubbery.

The pair—Joe Mike Tiesel of Rt. 7 and Charles Lee Harper, 922 N. Commercial—were arrested on court warrants after C. M. Greenlee, 890 N. Commercial accused them of destroying shrubbery and using profanity.

Greenlee told police that the pair had argued about entering his home to deal with him. The jail terms consisted of 20 days in the city lock-up and a year's probation was added on top of that.

A third youth, usually observed by police in the company of the pair who were jailed, was arrested separately Tuesday night while driving Tiesel's car. He was identified as Robert E. Hoover, Rt. 7, and was held for failure to post a total of \$25 in fines for driving with a noisy muffler and defective brakes.
