Scout Parade Route Mapped

In the tradition of the old time circus of long ago, downtown Salem Saturday afternoon at 3:30 will be the scene of a modern parade, heralding the opening of the Boy Scout circus at Sweetland field at 7:30 Saturday evening.

Nearly 3000 Cub, Boy and Senior Scouts will be in the line of march winding through the business section. Scouts will gather from 2:30 to 3 o'clock at Marion square, with the procession moving at 3:30 sharp.

The marchers will travel south on Commercial to State east to Liberty, north to Court, east on Court to High, south on High to Ferry and east on Ferry to Sweetland field, disbanding point.

There they will prepare for the big show that night before the grandstand. Immediately Lions club, sponsoring the circus, are to serve supper to all scouts.

Grand entry parade will begin promptly at 7:30, opening a fast-moving program presenting scouts in an absorbing series of events. There will be no dull moments. Clowns are prepared to see to that.

Scouts of Cascade Area council will be on hand from all parts of Marion, Polk and Linn counties to prove their prowess at Willamette valley scoutdom's biggest annual event. Carl Aschenbrenner is general chairman of the circus, assisted by Lions club committees assigned to various show details.

Lion Monroe Cheek is general coordinator, ringmaster, for the entire circus to see that the show clicks as neatly as Ringling Brothers best.

WHAT HAPPENED AT GEARHART?

De Cicco, Housekeeper Differ About Beating

Portland, Ore., May 6 (AP)—Mrs. Ramona Humphries Laurion 29, said Thursday she had parted company with Mike De Cicco, newly-elected treasurer of the state democratic central committee, she denied that her "sailor friends" had beaten up De Cicco at Gearhart, Ore., last Monday.

"I'm definitely through with him. I'm going home to Detroit," said Mrs. Laurion. She boarded an airliner at the Portland airport.

De Cicco told police that four friends of Mrs. Laurion — two sailors from Astoria and two civilians — broke into his Gearhart cottage and manhandled him.

De Cicco, a Portland tire dealer, said he had been em-

ploying Mrs. Laurion for a year and a half as an office worker and caretaker of his home.

"She was discharged by my son early last week. She had threatened to ruin me financially and political. She brought the four men to my cottage to beat me up," De Cicco said.

"I was alone in the house. One of the sailors started to come in through the door and I socked him. Another one started to come in and I hit him. There were two others. I couldn't handle four of them, so I

ran out and called state police."

Mrs. Laurion's version differed.

"There weren't any civilians with me, and the two sailors didn't lay a hand on him," Mrs. Laurion said. "They hardly got out of the car, which was parked outside."

"I've been cooking his meals. He was supposed to be home for supper at 6:30 p.m. Monday, but he didn't show up. So I got a car and drove to his beach home. I picked up two sailor friends of mine in Astoria."

"When we arrived at the cottage I found his car in the garage. As I entered the house, he went out the back door. No one touched him. The sailors were

still out at the car." against his assailants. Seaside District Attorney Garnett police said De Cicco hid in the Green of Clatsop county said brush for a short time after De Cicco had filed no complaint fleeing from the house.
