Check Made on Berry Damage. Frost damage to strawberries in Marion county has ranged from 10 to 90 percent according to scattered grower estimates received by County Extension Agent D. L. Rasmussen during the past week. Growers on the lower elevations bordering Lake Labish have reported the greatest damage. Noticeable damage has been reported by growers on the valley floor including Joe Henry, Brooks, Ed Zielinski, Hazel Green district; and Joe Smith, Woodburn. Hill growers generally had less frost damage than growers on the valley floor. From reports received to date, it appears that the former averaged about 10 percent damage while the average field on the valley floor had 25 to 50 percent injury.

Rasmussen points out that an accurate summary cannot be made until the picking season is under way. Frost injury varied considerably on adjoining plants. This fact alone would make it necessary to sample several hundred plants per acre so that a true average could be taken. Growers, cannery fieldmen and extension workers agree that the 1949 strawberry crop will be considerably less than the above average 1948 crop. "However, there will be strawberries to pick even though the crop will be below average," says Rasmussen.

Grains Firmer During Tuesday. Chicago, May 10 (AP)—Grains developed a firmer tone toward the close of today's board of trade session. The action of wheat at Minneapolis and Kansas City was reflected in national buying here. The May wheat contract was inclined to drag at times, but other wheat deliveries and corn pushed to the day's high. The five day wheat forecast, predicting warmer weather and little moisture, dried up offerings in the deferred wheat contracts. At the finish wheat was 1 1/2 to 1 7/8 higher than yesterday's finish, May \$2.22 1/4-23. Corn was 1/4 to 1 cent higher, May \$1.33 1/2-1/4. Oats were 1/4 to 1/2 higher, May 66 1/2-1/4. Rye was \$2.29 1/4-1/2. Lard was 8 to 10 cents a hundredweight higher, May \$11.70-72.

Winter Wheat Crop Forecast. Washington, May 10 (AP)—The agriculture department today forecast this year's winter wheat crop at 1,021,476,000 bushels as of May 1. This is 1,790,000 bushels more than the 1,019,686,000 forecast a month ago. It compares also with last year's crop of 990,098,000 and with a ten-year (1938-47) average of 726,553,000 bushels. No forecast was given on spring wheat. But if this class of wheat turns out at last year's size of about 300,000,000 bushels, the combined winter and spring crop would be 1,321,476,000 bushels. The largest wheat crop of record was 1,367,186,000 bushels, grown in 1947. Last year's crop was 1,228,406,000 bushels and the ten-year average is 942,623,000 bushels.

Bridge Engineer's Body Discovered. Three Salem brothers boating in the Willamette river just north of the bridge late Monday afternoon found the body of W. A. King, 47, superintendent of construction on the Independence bridge, who was drowned the afternoon of April 6. Still missing is the body of Robert C. Woods who was drowned at the same time. A. J. Prichard, third member of a crew stringing a cable across the river, was rescued at the time of the accident. The boys are Kenny, 14, Warren, 18, and Billy Lottis, 13, of 2333 N. River road. The body, sighted near their home, was caught between logs near the east bank of the river. All three will share in the \$250 award offered by Arthur B. Woods, Dalby, brother of the missing man, for the discovery of either body.

Stocks Decline Around Point. New York, May 10 (AP)—Lackadaisical buying allowed the stock market to drop fractions to around a point today. The closing bell showed a thorough mixture of gains and losses but losses were in a clear majority. Turnover was at the rate of only 700,000 shares for the full session. One of the most active issues for a while was American Ice Common, which ran up around a point to about 7 1/2, a new high for the year, following news that the company had asked for tenders of the stock at a price not to exceed \$9 a share. Also ahead most of the day were Republic Steel, Studbaker, Firestone, Montgomery Ward, Northern Pacific and Transcontinental & Western Air. U.S. Steel, on comparatively large turnover, lost around a point. Others lower included Youngtown Sheet, Goodrich, Pacific Western Oil, Twentieth Century-Fox, American Telephone and U.S. Gypsum.
