Verdict Given In Two Estates

A transfer of funds from the estate of one deceased person to that of another deceased person circuit court in a judgment read Friday.

Chester E. Weber, administra-tor of the estate of Bernice Betty Weber, was awarded a \$4,883 judgment over John TeSelle, as administrator of the estate of Thomas Drake.

The two men were traveling in a car operated by Drake when the fatal accident occured. Also killed was Drake's wife, Patri-cia. The only survivor of the crash, and consequently the only witness, was Mrs. Weber's hus band, the plaintiff in the law

The complaint alleged that negligence on the part of Drake had caused the accident. The plaintiff had asked \$10,000 dam-
