

Plan Caravan Trip to Willamette Project Dams

The Chamber of Commerce today announced the schedule for the trip of business men, engineers and officials to the Willamette valley project damsites on June 11 and 12.

The auto caravan will leave Salem at 7:30 a.m., daylight saving time, Saturday, June 11, from the north entrance of the State House.



Big Cliff damsite, the reregulating dam below the Detroit dam, will be the first stop, and Detroit site next. Leaving the Detroit damsite, the caravan will back-track to Stayton, to Jefferson and to Albany where the Albany Chamber of Commerce will be host for lunch at the Hub restaurant. Col. O. E. Walsh will give an explanation of each unit of the project seen on the day's trip.

The next stop will be the Harborsburg revetment, and from there the caravan will go to Fern Ridge reservoir. The Eugene Yacht club will be out in force with sail boats, speed boats and sightseeing boats. The club has over 150 members.

At 4:30 standard time the caravan will arrive in Eugene where a banquet will be served at 6:30 p.m.

Sunday, June 12, the caravan will leave the Eugene hotel at 8 a.m. standard time. First stop will be the Ferry street revetment, and from there through Springfield to Jasper. The excursionists will then cross the middle fork of the Willamette, and travel along the new railroad grade back to Highway 58 on the south side of the river to Lowell.

The next stop will be the site of the proposed Hills Creek dam above Oakridge. From Hills Creek the party will move to the railroad construction for Meridian dam below Lowell, and then move to Dorena dam. The Dorena Dam company will be host for lunch, with a stop of two hours.

The last stop will be Cottage Grove reservoir. There the party will disband.

Chambers Says Hiss Told Lies

New York, June 1 (AP)—Whittaker Chambers, self-styled former communist, took the witness stand today to back up a government charge that Alger Hiss lied about his communist connections.

Chambers, who has said he knew Hiss as a purveyor of government documents to the Reds, was expected to be the main witness against Hiss.

Hiss, former state department employee and high administration diplomat, is accused of perjury.

Earlier, government and defense counsel indicated the case against Hiss might rest largely on an old typewriter.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas F. Murphy declared in his opening address to the federal court jury that between 25 and 30 FBI agents had scoured Washington to no avail in a search for the machine on which he said Hiss or his wife copied state department documents.

Then Hiss' attorney, Lloyd Paul Stryker, created a stir in the crowded courtroom by stating the defense had located the typewriter.

In his opening address to the jury of ten men and two women Stryker said that under certain conditions the defense would let the FBI look at the machine "all they want."

Portland, Ore., June 1 (AP)—Bonneville power administration today announced four contract awards for work in Oregon and Washington.

William G. Vandyke, Reno, Nev., was granted a job to clear right-of-way for the Forest Grove-McMinnville 115-kilovolt transmission line on a low bid of \$29,000.

Lacy Construction Co., Portland, was awarded a contract to construct the Lebanon line terminal additions at the Albany sub station on a bid of \$7,379.

Railway and Industrial Engineering Co., Greensburg, Pa., received a contract for disconnecting switches at Ampere, Wash., on a bid of \$56,000.

Joslyn Pacific Co., Portland, with a low bid of \$121,948, got a contract for bus and switch insulators, also for ampere.

Plane Beats Stork in Race

Albany, June 1—The stork lost a race here Tuesday morning after a journey of 6,634 miles when Mr. and Mrs. Marshall Leeson, 2110 East First street, became the parents of a seven pound one and a half ounce son May 31, at the Albany General hospital.

Mrs. Leeson left Berlin, Germany, Friday, May 27 for Albany.

The German war bride, 19, made the trip across the Atlantic, was stalled by an airplane mixup in New York, and made the transcontinental trip alone, except for her Berlin-born son. She arrived in Albany Sunday afternoon. Leeson had left Germany last March.

Mrs. Leeson is a Berlin-born daughter of a wartime German navy captain. She and the Minneapolis-born Marshall Leeson met late in 1947 when he was sent over to Berlin with an army engineering outfit. Shortly afterward the couple were married. During the blockade Leeson participated in the improvement of Templehof airport in the Russian-blockaded city.

The Leesons are living now at the home of Leeson's father, Cornelius Leeson, a retired construction worker.

Peddlers Market Gas Bomb Pencils

Police puzzled for an hour Wednesday and finally released two peddlers who have been canvassing Salem taverns in an effort to market gas bomb pencils.

The pencils are designed to carry a blank cartridge in the top. When a button is pushed, the shell, containing gas is set off. The salesman told police that the pencils could be used to frustrate holdups or break up fights.

To Police Chief Clyde A. Warren, however, the pencils were considered as a possible source of real trouble.

"A man who used one of these in a tight spot," Warren explained, "would only be inviting someone to shoot him."

Sheriff to Go On DLS Time

Thursday morning the clock in the legal offices of Sheriff Denver Young will be shoved ahead an hour to conform to daylight savings time. This move is taken as result of the circuit judges reaching a conclusion Tuesday to place the circuit court business on that time instead of standard time which prevails in the rest of the county house. Business of the sheriff's legal department is so intertwined with that of the circuit and district courts now on daylight savings time Sheriff Young said he is making the move to avoid confusion.

However, the sheriff's tax collection department will remain on standard time as will other offices in the courthouse and the clock on the courthouse tower as well. County offices have maintained standard time in compliance with statutory regulations which fix their opening and closing hours on that basis. Sheriff Young Wednesday advised the county court of his decision to change to daylight saving time.

San Francisco, June 1 (AP)—A federal grand jury convenes today to renew its investigation of possible communist influences in west coast labor unions.

The hearing was a continuation of the one that led to the indictment of CIO longshore leader Harry Bridges and two of his aides on charges of perjury and conspiracy in connection with his naturalization in 1945.
