

Ship Beached, 30 Await Rescue

Vancouver, B.C., June 7 (CP)—The 502-ton Canadian government ship Alberni has been beached on Alsebrook Island after running aground and its crew of 30 are awaiting rescue.

The R.C.A.F. in Vancouver reports the 157-foot fisheries patrol boat sent an SOS this morning that it was sinking off canoe rocks, about 40 miles north of the tip of Vancouver Island.

A later report said the ship had been beached and the crew is waiting on Calvert Island for rescue. It is not known immediately whether any of the crew suffered injury.

The Salvage King from Victoria is on its way to the stricken ship and a British Columbia packers boat is reported en route to Calvert to rescue the Alberni's crew.

\$1000 Raised for Survivors of Fire

Hazleton, Pa., June 7 (AP)—More than \$1,000 poured into a relief fund today for a West Hazleton couple and their nine remaining children after fire wrecked their home and killed five of their sons.

Steven Gaizick, a mine laborer, is in critical condition at Hazleton state hospital. His wife and a son, Robert, seven, also are reported in critical condition, suffering multiple burns and internal injuries.



'Plane of Tomorrow'—Consolidated Vultee built this jet-powered Air Force research plane to prove the design superiority of the triangle-shaped Delta wing over conventional sweptback wing styles.
