All Grains Lose In Monday Trade

Chicago, June 13 (UPI)—Grains lost ground rapidly toward the close today, ending with fairly substantial losses. Early gains extending to more than a cent in wheat were wiped out under light but persistent selling. Corn and oats were weak from the start.

Demand dried up, partly because of declines in cash wheat prices and partly because of nervousness resulting from another drop in securities at New York. Rains over the weekend served to depress corn.

New crop wheat was being purchased on a to-arrive basis at Kansas City at prices 4 to 7 cents under last Saturday's cash dealers said. Visible supply of wheat increased 4,120,000 bushels during the past week, of trade reported.

Wheat closed 1 1/4-2 1/2 lower, July \$1.93-\$1.94, corn was 1 1/2 to 2 cents lower, July \$1.30-\$1.4, oats were 1 1/4-1 1/2 lower, July 58, rye was 1 1/4-2 1/2 lower, July \$1.34-\$1, soybeans were 2 1/2 to 4 cents lower, July \$2.22-\$2.24, and lard was 8 to 30 cents a hundred pounds lower, July \$11.12.

Stocks Plunge To 4 Year Low

New York, June 13 (UPI)—The stock market plunged to a four-year low today in one of the sharpest declines of the year.

A steady flow of selling orders pounded prices down fractions to an extreme of 6 points. Most losses were around 2 points or less.

The volume of trading expanded as the market weakened. Turnover was at the rate of around 1,300,000 shares for the full session, which would result in one of the busiest days of the year.

Today's spill represented a continuation of a downward trend that started around a month ago and which has persisted almost without interruption.

Wall Street quarters saw nothing startling in the news to account for the price weakness, but merely fresh accent on the gloomy thinking on the course of business which has dominated the financial district for a long time.
