

Labor Set for Eugene Session

Amendment of the social security law so that worker and employer contributions be 5 per cent instead of 1 per cent will be the provision of a resolution to be offered by Salem labor delegates to the state convention of the Oregon Federation of Labor in Eugene.

During the week-end a meeting of the convention starts Monday and about 50 members will be present from Salem unions. Heading the Salem contingent will be Herbert E. Barker, who is executive secretary of the Salem Trades and Labor Council and vice chairman of the convention committee on laws and legislation, and F. J. Boehringer, district representative on the executive board.

Among public questions to be discussed in the convention will be socialized medicine, the Taft-Hartley law, and the Columbia valley authority.

Convict Guilty of Setting Flax Fire

Reuben J. Partlow, convict, was found guilty Wednesday by a circuit court jury of aiding in setting a flax fire at the state penitentiary last Monday. Only 25 minutes were used up in deliberations. Partlow said he wasn't involved in the crime but Peter Luthy, flax farm superintendent, gave testimony that he saw Partlow helping set it.

Partlow is one of seven convicts indicted for setting fire to the stack of flax and Paul LeRoy Gardner is on trial Thursday for the same offense. Partlow's sentence will be imposed later.

Hams to Have Disaster Drill

The transmitting equipment will probably be kept on the air continuously for the 24-hour period, in order to make as many contacts as possible with other field day stations all over the country.
