## Art Exhibit

An exhibition of the work of Charles Heaney, Portland artist, opened Thursday at the Elfstrom Art galleries and will be up for two weeks.

Mr. Heaney is a widely known northwest artist. He was one of 10 northwest artists whose work was chosen for a select exhibit in New York City, the collection later being taken through the country. He has been up in such magazines as American Artist and American Magazine of Art.

The current exhibit comprises oils and lithographs done by Mr. Heaney. The oils represent all periods of his work, including the realism type—such as an old Portland street scene—the atmospheric landscape types as in his views of mountains and desert scenes in eastern Oregon, and some of his fossil paintings for which he is most noted. Also

there are some of his map type paintings. In the print room are some of his lithographs which follow the same line of interest of his fossil works, being of small living and growing things.

Also in the print room are reproductions of Mark Tobey's work, the gallery having a portfolio of the works with a select number chosen for exhibit.
