Corn Advances, Wheat Lower

Chicago, June 22.—Wheat fell back on the Board of Trade today, giving up the market's leadership to corn. The latter grain moved ahead in a fairly brisk trade following an agriculture department forecast of a whopping big pig crop this year.

Some selling in wheat represented profit-taking by longs. In part, the lessened enthusiasm for wheat was based on a report from Kansas State college agricultural experts that damage to the wheat crop has not been as great as some crop observers have asserted.

The pig crop forecast caused some selling in lard, but this was partly offset by trade advices that Mexico was in the market for 3,500,000 pounds of American lard.

Wheat closed 3-1/4 lower, July \$1.99 3/4, corn was 1/4 higher, July \$1.33 1/2, oats were 1/8 higher, July 80 1/2, rye was 1/8 higher, July \$1.41 1/2, soybeans were 1/8 lower to 1 cent higher.

Stocks Decline Irregularly

New York, June 22.—The stock market moved into lower price ground today and stayed there throughout the session. Losses ranged from fractions to around a point. Numerous stocks, at the same time, failed to appear on the ticker tape at all or inched ahead.

The market opened without a conclusive trend but almost immediately started tilting lower. The decline was soon checked and very faint signs of a comeback showed up here and there.

There was no urgency to the buying or selling. Business was slowest thus far in the week, with turnover in the neighborhood of 600,000 shares for the full session.

Lower most of the time were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem Steel, General Motors, Studebaker, U. S. Rubber, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, Santa Fe, Standard Oil (NJ) Mission Corp., and Loew's.

Earl T. Newberry Acting Governor

Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry was acting Governor of Oregon today, and will keep the job for the rest of the week. Governor Douglas McKay is attending the national governors conference in Colorado Springs, Colo., and will return Saturday night.

The next two in line of succession to the governorship are Senate President William E. Walsh, Coos Bay, and House Speaker Frank J. Van Dyke, Medford. They left by plane last night for Washington, D. C., to attend congressional hearing on the proposed Columbia valley authority.

AFL Votes for More Security

Eugene, June 22.—The independent spirit of delegates to the State Federation of Labor convention was more in evidence today. Once again delegates on the floor overrode recommendations of their officials yesterday, passing a resolution that had been turned down by Eugene Allen's committee on laws and legislation.

The day previous they had voted for outright appeal of the Taft-Hartley act, ignoring advice from officials. The vote yesterday came on a resolution that advocates extension of social security to all workers. It proposes lifting contributions from 1 to 5 percent, lowering of old age limits from 65 to 60 years, and payments of \$75 monthly to recipients.

The committee recommended against the bill, arguing that the national AFL should set the policy. Confusion would result if each state worked up its own ideas, the committee said.

Members of the Salem labor council proposed a resolution to invite the CIO to return to the AFL. The national AFL has issued such invitations repeatedly. The resolution is to be considered today.
