RELIGION BECOMES HOT TOPIC Old Prayers, March of Events Dont Jibe, Some Jews Think

By ERIC GOTTGETREU Tel Aviv, Israel (AP)—The march of events has caught up with the old Hebrew prayers, and some Jews in Israel think it is time for a change. There is the traditional pass-over prayer: "Next year we are slaves, next year free men."

But religion is a hot topic in Israel today. Opinions differ sharply about the state law, the educational system and public life in general. Agreement is being sought. It probably will be brought about by a working compromise between those who believe that religious observance should be written into the law of the land and those who lean to separation of synagogue and state.

As a matter of fact, this already is apparent in many of the younger settlers and factory workers, and among the socialist groups. For instance, the leftist mapam party vehemently opposes the word "God" being written into the preamble of the Israel constitution now being drafted.
