



## 1949 to be Remembered as "The Caterpillar" Year

County Extension Agent D. L. Rasmussen is convinced that 1949 will be remembered as the "caterpillar" year. At any rate, there are more caterpillars bothering Marion county farmers this year than any other since the war.

First it was tent caterpillars on fruit trees last spring. They were controlled by burning or spraying.

Next came caterpillars on mint. Jack Gilmore of the Jefferson area reported a heavy infestation in one of his fields. Gilmore reported a DDT dust program controlled the caterpillars very nicely.

Last week, it was one of the biggest caterpillars usually seen in this area. The hornworm made at least a half dozen farmers contact the county agent's office for information about control.

"I didn't blame them for being worried," said Rasmussen. "A caterpillar three inches long with a horn like a rose thorn would scare anybody who hadn't seen a hornworm before."

Fortunately, the hornworms reported were feeding on weeds rather than on the oats, vetch, or other crops in fields infested by the pests. In adjoining fields owned by S. W. Annen and Iver Twito of Woodburn, the hornworm population was enough to warrant control measures.



ures if the caterpillars started feeding on field crops.

Since the caterpillars would eventually burrow into the soil, pupate, and emerge as sphinx moths, most growers were following a policy of "wait and see" before spraying or dusting with DDT or lead arsenate.

By Saturday, Rasmussen had seen more hornworms in six days than he had seen in the past three years. He was wondering what other caterpillar was to be next on the list.
