Portland, July 13 — The Oregon All-Stars and Portland All-Stars, when they clash here at Multnomah stadium August 27, will aim at some tough offensive records established in last year's first annual Shrine's hospital all-football game.

Some of the figures recorded in the opening classic may be on the books for years to come as this game between graduated high school seniors develops through the years. Sam Baker of Corvallis, who scored four touchdowns and 24 points for Oregon, has the record that most grid observers feel will withstand assault the longest time. Another is the mark of five conversions held by Jerry Mitchell of Ashland, who was successful in each attempt as the upstate team whipped Portland 35 to 13.

Two others that may be a long time in being erased are the punt of 56 yards by Pat Duff of Grant and the pass interception return of 80 yards by Baker.

Many of the others are sure to fall in this year's tilt. The coaches have been permitted to employ any style of offense. Soth Eric Waldorf of the Portland team and Mel Ingram of Oregon have announced that they plan to vary their attacks, mixing both T-formation and single wingback. They may employ different units for each style.
