Method: Have butcher cut excess fat from around round steak and put meat through prinder only once. Flatten meat on paper in which it is wrapped into an oblong about 4 x 6 inches; do not mix. Cut into four pieces and shape edges in oblong patty form. Melt butter or margarine in heavy 8-inch skillet until quite hot but not brown; place hamburger patties in skillet until quite hot but not brown; place hamburger patties in skillet and cook over moderate heat grinder only once.
