Chicago, July 30 (AP)—Grains got off to a weak start and never showed any rallying power on the board of trade today. Dealings were fairly active during the first 30 minutes, but after that the market just loafed along with the trend lower.

In wheat there was some disappointment over trade reports the Kansas City commodity credit corporation office had not bought any cash grain yesterday, as some traders had expected it would. The cash grain price was lowered in the southwestern market today.

Wheat closed 1 1/2-1 3/4 lower, September \$2.05-\$2.04 3/4, corn was 1 1/4-1 1/2 lower, September \$1.28 1/2-3/4, oats were 3/4-7/8 lower, September 65 1/2-7/8, rye was 2 1/4-3 1/4 lower, September \$1.51-5 1/2, soybeans were unchanged to 1/2 lower, November \$2.35-3 1/4, and land was 3 cents lower to 30 cents a hundred pounds higher, September \$12.37.

Mike Elliott and Wife Make Defense on Radio

Portland Ore., July 30 (AP)—Multnomah county Sheriff M. L. Elliott implied last night in a radio address that those seeking his office feared the investigation he is currently undertaking.

The sheriff and his wife made a 15-minute broadcast over Portland station KXL in his first reply to a citizens' group seeking a recall election.

"The broadcast was an appeal to the voters of Multnomah county to 'decide for yourself and by yourself'."

"Could it possibly be that they (those seeking his recall) are using every power at their disposal to try to sway and prejudice you to recall me before I have a chance to complete my findings and lay them before you, the people?"

"Could it be they are frightened at what I will uncover, that some shady deals might come to light and that you will be allowed to see some of the dealings which have taken place?"

In a caustic tone, Elliott described those opposing him as "politicians" whose "gibbering" might sway the people of the county.

He appealed to his constituents to ignore these "politicians" and refuse to sign the recall petitions.

Mrs. Elliott went on to describe her husband's character as "on the highest plane."

The broadcast was sponsored by the "Committee for a Fair Play" and was transcribed electrically at noon yesterday for broadcast last night.
