## Harness Races Clipped, **Quarters Added for Fair**

Charles A. Evans, race superintendent for the State Fair, announced Friday that quarter horse sprints would be included on the Lone Oak program this year for the first time in the history of the fair. His announcement was coupled with the disclosure that no

harness racing would be listed on the card of race events. During the 1948 fair, an afternoon program of harness racing failed to measure up to expectations from the spectator's view or in financial returns.

Evans said, however, that at least one quarter-horse dash would be included on the daily program. Quarter horses, favorites of western stockmen, were bred in colonial days for their ability to start rapidly and hit top speed for short-


