

Verdict in Six Weeks on Feeder-Lines vs. United

San Francisco, Aug. 11 (AP)—Paul Pfeiffer, examiner for the civil aeronautics board, said today that he would return a verdict in about six weeks on the proposal to change airline service to six California and Oregon cities.

Pfeiffer last Saturday concluded six days of hearings on the CAB's proposal to suspend United Air lines service to Santa Barbara, Salinas, Monterey, Red Bluff, Eureka, and Klamath Falls. Under the proposal these cities would be serviced exclusively by Southwest Air lines.

Pfeiffer said both United and Southwest would be given an opportunity to file briefs after his verdict is handed down. The final verdict will be made by the full board in Washington "sometime in 1950," Pfeiffer said.

During the six-day hearing, Southwest Air lines through its president, John Connelly, contended that the exclusive franchise would enable Southwest to give better service to the cities involved at less cost to the government. Connelly said that the increased revenues from the exclusive franchise would reduce the government's mail subsidies to Southwest by \$177,000.

Southwest's stand was supported by officials from the CAB and the post office department. The CAB proposal cited "uneconomic competition" between the two airlines for business in these cities and post office spokesman Earl Wadsworth testified Saturday that his department was in full accord with the CAB recommendations.

In rebuttal, United Air Lines President W. A. Patterson sharply criticized the board and Southwest for their "rock-throwing tactics."

Other United officials testified that the people of the cities concerned desired to retain the United certificate "because it gives them both local and transcontinental service."

This contention was supported by representatives of the cities who testified at the hearing last Monday.

United also challenged Southwest's claim that cost to the government would be reduced by the proposed transfer. A United official said his air line's deficit would increase by \$403,000 if these cities were taken from the United route. Since the government makes up air line deficits through mail subsidies, it would have to bear this added expense, United claimed.

Mother Asks Baby's Return

Frankfurt, Germany, Aug. 11 (AP)—The German bride of an American soldier appealed today for return of their baby, which the soldier took to the United States.

The soldier is Sgt. Charlton B. Chapline, 32, of 3104 South-

west Nebraska street, Portland, Ore. Army records show he flew to the United States July 30 with the couple's 5-month-old son, Charlton Bryan Chapline.

An army chaplain, Capt. J. K. Jung, said Mrs. Chapline had refused to accompany Chapline to the United States.

Now the mother, 25, has appealed to the American Red Cross and employed a German lawyer in an attempt to recover the child.

Her task is complicated, how-

ever, by the fact the baby has been registered with the U. S. consulate here as an American citizen.

"I don't know what she can do now except join her husband and baby in America," the chaplain said.

Red Cross officials said they could not handle such a case.

Mrs. Chapline, the former Ruth Margot Balbach, lives in Wiesbaden, where the sergeant was assigned to an army hospital unit.

Fishing Boat Fearless Burns in Columbia

Longview, Aug. 11 (AP)—The 81-foot fishing boat Fearless, owned by H. L. Castner of Portland and L. E. Tate of Timber, Ore., burned last night in the Columbia river at Oak Grove.

The fire broke out in the engine room with one man, Bill Fields, aboard. Fields had to jump overboard to escape the flames.

The gas tanks exploded soon thereafter. Tate estimates the loss as being between \$40,000 and \$45,000.
