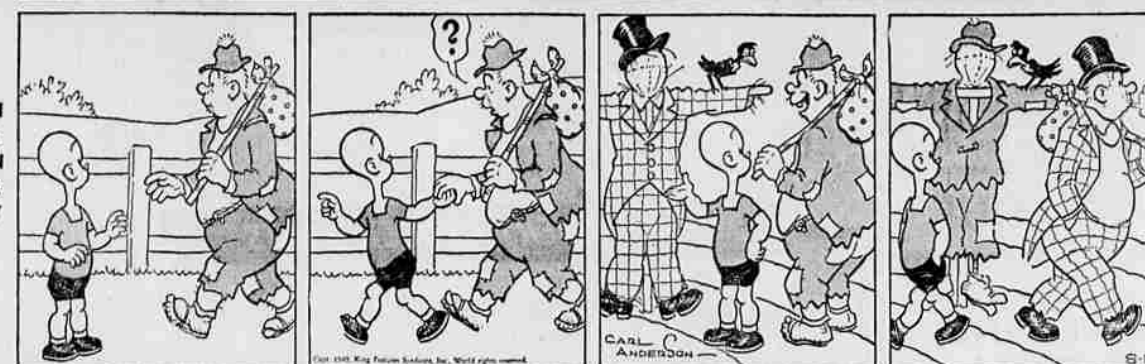
"I want to question all of you," said the detective. "It won't take long." This last remark surprised Priscilla. She had not expected him to make any show of consideration.
