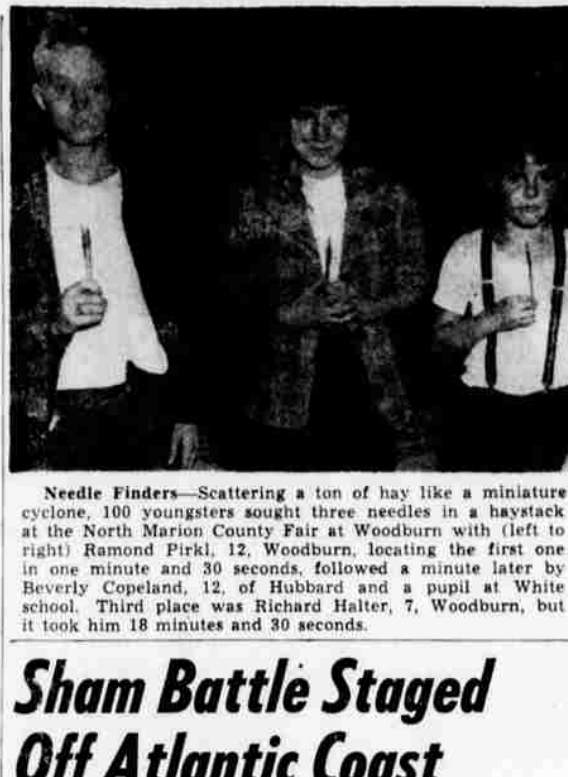

Moscow, Sept. 26 (AP)—The Russian people greeted with calmness today the news of Soviet possession of the atom bomb and there was no sign of anti-American sentiment among street gatherings.

The announcement was made in a 56-line statement by the official Soviet news agency Tass in the style reserved for pronouncements from the government itself.

This statement signified that the Soviet Union already had discovered the secret of the atomic weapon and had this weapon at its disposal.
