

Commy Leaders' Trial Near End

New York, Oct. 6 (AP)—The criminal conspiracy trial of 11 American communist leaders began its 162nd trial day today with only one more obstacle to hurdle before entering the final summation stage.

Defense summations were scheduled to begin shortly after Federal Judge Harold R. Medina rules on a final defense motion, but a defense attorney's bad cold threatened further delay.

Richard Gladstein, counsel for defendant Robert Thompson and Gus Hall, was bedridden and unable to attend the start of the final word-fest.

Medina was expected to ask Thompson and Hall to allow the summations to continue without their lawyer, trusting to the four other defense attorneys to protect their rights. But if they refuse, a postponement of at least one more day was likely.

Indications were that the 5,000,000-word, \$667,000 trial would be over before a far-right-winger could say dialectical materialism—probably going to the jury one week from the start of summations. U.S. Attorney John F. X. McGohey had planned to sum up the prosecution all day next Wednesday.

Medina, who has rocked away the trial days in his high-backed chair since the opening last Jan. 17—jailed five of the 11 defendants for contempt—was expected to take a good deal of Thursday, Oct. 13, for his charge to the jury of eight women and four men. The jury probably will get the case Thursday evening.

Anderson Charges Brannan Plan Strategy

Washington, Oct. 6 (AP)—Sen. Clinton P. Anderson, (D-N.M.), charged today that some administration groups are trying to force high farm supports to gain eventual passage of the Brannan plan.

Anderson made the charge as a bipartisan long-range farm bill went back to the senate agriculture committee for revision. Advocates of high farm supports wrote in a provision to keep price supports at 90 per cent of parity for so-called basic farm crops. The committee got instructions to report the bill back in 48 hours.

Vice President Alben W. Barkley twice cast the deciding vote against the Anderson proposal for flexible price supports. Barkley voted for rigid high supports. He said he had always urged them as a senator, and added: "I cannot change my position now."

Japs In Manchuria Said Joining Reds

Tokyo, Japan, Oct. 6 (AP)—About half of the 60,000 Japanese remaining in Manchuria and North China are either in the Chinese Communist 8th Route Army or working for the communists, a recently-arrived Japanese repatriate said today.

An attractive Eurasian taxi dancer, who arrived from Harbin, Manchuria, said the Russians were sending home only those Japanese who could not be used by the Chinese communist army.
