Perez Spices States' Rights Battle Lines in New Post

Baton Rouge, La.—Leander H. Perez, the States Rights' new permanent Washington representative, has peppered Louisiana's political gumbo for many years. He will keep the states rights issue from going flat on the capital's palate.

Perez' bailiwick is Plaquemines Parish (Persimmon county). His career has been punctuated with brilliantly argued lawsuits, bitter campaigns, a boat explosion and a clash with the state militia.

No session of the Louisiana legislature is complete without its complement of bills killed in their track or propelled through committee hearings by a blast of Perez oratory.

In addition to his other duties, he is now a special assistant to the Louisiana attorney general to help represent the state in the tidelands ownership controversy. His district is a multi-national melting pot swept by trappers' feuds. From it Perez makes frequent and usually spectacular excursions into the state's political frays.

He was one of the late Huey P. Long's defense counsel during the historic—and unsuccessful—attempts in 1928 to remove Long from the governor's chair by impeachment.

Perez was one of the master minds in the campaign of the present governor, Earl K. Long, though Long kept aloof from the states' rights movement.

The boat explosion occurred in 1941. Perez had lent the craft to a group of friends. When one turned the ignition key, the boat blew up. Nobody was hurt badly. Some called it an attempt to assassinate Perez.

He bitterly opposed the administration of Gov. Sam H. Jones, who defeated the Long faction in 1940.

During Jones' term was fought the "Battle of Plaquemines," with the state militia, 500 strong, on one side and Perez and his cohorts on the other.

The battle brewed when the parish sheriff died in 1943. Governor Jones named Walter J. Blalze as acting sheriff. Perez ensconced Coroner Ben Slater to serve until an election could be held. He refused to seat Blalze. Jones declared martial law and ordered the militia to the parish seat, Pointe-a-La-Hache.

The guardsmen escorted Slater out of the courthouse. Blalze was sworn in as sheriff. Plaquemines Parish had martial law for some time and court calendars swelled with lawsuits from both sides.

CVA Hearing In December

Washington, Oct. 13 (AP)—Chairman Dennis Chavez of the senate public works committee said today that December is the earliest possible time field hearings can be held on the Columbia valley administration.

The New Mexico democrat gave reassurances that the hearings "definitely" will be held. But he said they could not be conducted sooner "because of the lateness of the congressional session and private commitments of the members."

Chavez said most committee members wanted to go home after adjournment and that he is going to Europe.

"We will want to spend what time is needed in the northwest giving deliberate study to the proposals for the development of the Columbia . . . and this will mean that we cannot make any rushed trip," Chavez said.

Czechs Confiscate U. S. News Bulletin

Prague, Czechoslovakia, Oct. 13 (AP)—Two thousand copies of the United States information service's Czech language bulletin were confiscated by police today because it carried a story on the state department's protest over the jailing of an American student here.

The U.S. embassy protested vainly.

Joseph Kolarek, press attache at the American embassy, said Czech police labelled the story as untruthful. He said they also claimed the article violated the law of the defense of the republic.

Kolarek said the USIS story was a straight news story based on the state department protest. The student is Savel Klinchko, 27, of Palo Alto, Calif., who said he was arrested September 29 in a Slovakian town as a suspected spy and then held in solitary confinement for five days before being released.

McCord Field Alaskan Base

McCord Field, Oct. 13 (AP)—This air force base, military gateway to Alaska, is changing over from a medium troop carrier operation to a heavy carrier group installation.

The first of a group of four-engine C-54s arrived this week to replace the C-82 flying boxcars which have long been a familiar sight in shuttle service between McCord, Alaska and other distant points.

The C-54s are the army air force version of the commercial DC-4s. Thirty-six of the big carriers will be assigned to this base, compared with the 48 two-engine flying boxcars heretofore stationed here. The C-82s will be assigned to AAF bases around the world.

Significance of the changeover, air force men indicated, lies in the fact that the heavier planes will give the McCord troop carrier group a greater range by 1000 miles.
