Mrs. Norwood Lectures Here

Mrs. Elisabeth F. Norwood, C.S.B. of Brookline, Mass., spoke here last night in the Leslie junior high school auditorium.

The title of her lecture was "Christian Science—The Religion of Love, which Heals." The following are a few of the points she brought out to substantiate the fact that Christian Science is a religion of love and that it does heal:

"Sometimes we find a person who considers himself an atheist, that is, one who disbelieves in the existence of a God, or a Supreme Being. But truly there is no such person as an atheist; for any thinking person knows he is not self-created, that he does not govern the universe or control events. He knows that there is something outside of himself, above, beyond himself, which is in control. He may call that something power, force, or some other name, but that something is his God.

"In Christian Science God, who is Love, is incorporeal, that is, without a material body. If God, Love, were corporeal, somehow, somewhere, some time, someone would have seen God. But in Exodus (33:20) it is recorded that God says, 'Thou canst not see my face: for there shall no man see me and live.' Although Love cannot be seen by the material senses, the presence of Love is mentally realized."

Boost in 5-Cent Coin Box Phone Suggested

Seattle, Oct. (AP)—A boost in the rate of 5 cent coin-box telephone calls was suggested today in hearings on a proposed telephone rate increase asked by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company.

Testimony on the requested \$7,000,000 total revenue increase is being heard by the state public service commission.

Fred J. Lordan, special assistant attorney general, asked company assistant vice president George M. Dean why public phone patrons should not contribute their share of the higher tolls.

Dean replied that the Western Electric company could not turn out enough coin boxes arranged to take dimes instead of nickels.

However, Lordan pointed out that the Bell company in New York state was arranging to get 10 cent coin boxes, in connection with its application for a general increase in telephone rates.
