Stocks Advance Up to 2 Points

New York, Oct. 26 (AP)—Numerous key stocks edged up to new highs for the year in a generally improved market today.

Gains ranged from fractions to an extreme of around 2 points. Most additions were a point or less.

Some quarters in the financial district linked the improvement with what had the earmarks of a revival of efforts to settle the stock strikes.

Turnover hit a rate of around 1,500,000 shares for the full session. Highs for 1949 were hit by among others—U. S. Steel, General Motors and Du Pont.

Westinghouse Electric slipped a bit, in the face of news that a 65-cent dividend would share 1949 payments to \$1.40 a share from \$1.25 paid last year, but later rallied.

Higher prices were paid for Bethlehem Steel, Chrysler, Studebaker, Goodrich Tire, Boeing, Zenith, American Telephone, McIntyre Porcelain, Standard Oil (N.J.) Borden Oil, and Colgate.

Railroad stocks were inclined to hold back.

Soule Held by Chinese Reds

Washington, Oct. 26 (AP)—Secretary of State Acheson said today that Chinese communist authorities are using a "flimsy pretext" to prevent the departure from Nanking of Gen. Robert B. Soule, American military attache to China.

Acheson said in a statement that Soule has been refused an exit visa because of a demand by Chinese employes of the U. S. government that the general remain on the scene until their demands for "exorbitant servants pay" are settled.

Acheson said this government "will not authorize its representatives in China to submit to such pressure."
