Detroit Plans New Boundary

A second attempt to incorporate the city of Detroit with proposed new boundary lines was launched before the county court Thursday.

Justice Edison Vickers of the Breitenbush district filed with the court new petitions asking for an election date. The new petitions carry 86 names.

Justice Vickers states that the map of the proposed new area shows three miles cut off from the east end of the territory first sought to be incorporated or about two and a half sections of land.

On the east end a part of Idanha is cut off. Eliminated from the proposed new area are several mills including Idanha Lumber company, Harvey Lumber company, Idanha Veneer company, Pamela Lumber company and the old CCC camp.

Vickers said he figures that in the area taken out there were 87 votes cast against the measure at the first election. Some land taken into the new area, he figures, will add 47 affirmative votes to the proposition.

The county court, as yet, has not set a date for the new election.
