

Laws to Bar Subversive Teachers Have Many Fates

Legislation to bar subversive teachers from the public schools has been enacted, or defeated, in at least 25 states, a United Press survey showed today.

The seven states that rejected anti-subversive legislation did so on the ground that such action would be a slap at patriotic teachers or would not be effective in weeding subversives from teaching jobs.

Seven states adopted so-called outright anti-subversive laws and 11 require teachers to take loyalty oaths.

In four states, courts have prohibited enforcement of anti-subversive laws pending final determination of their constitutionality.

In Maryland, the state's highest court has reserved decision on attacks against its anti-subversive law which provides sentences up to 20 years and fines up to \$20,000 for any person actively participating in organizations which advocate the overthrow by force or violence of the state or federal governments. A lower tribunal declared the law unconstitutional but the state has asked the court of appeals to review the decision.

The communist party has secured a temporary order restraining the New York's educational board from acting under its new anti-subversive law.

In Massachusetts, the communist party was unsuccessful in its attempts to get a temporary court order restraining the commonwealth from enforcing its broad anti-subversive legislation. The law provides that members of the communist party shall not be employed in any capacity by the state or any of its political subdivisions.

New Jersey's loyalty oath law has been declared unconstitutional.

Texas, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Tennessee also have anti-subversive laws which pertain to teachers. Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, New Hampshire, North Dakota and South Dakota required teachers to take loyalty oaths.

Although California has no loyalty oaths for teachers, members of the University of California faculty are required to

Disabled Vet's Auto Bill Killed

Washington, Nov. 2 (U.P.)—A bill to give automobiles to some 15,000 seriously disabled veterans is dead. President Truman killed it by a pocket veto.

The president said it would be "unsound public policy" to approve such legislation. He said the measure, if enacted into

law, might lead to government gifts of automobiles to all disabled veterans.

The bill would have given a \$1600 automobile to any veteran of either world war I or II who lost the use of a hand or foot or who had seriously defective vision.

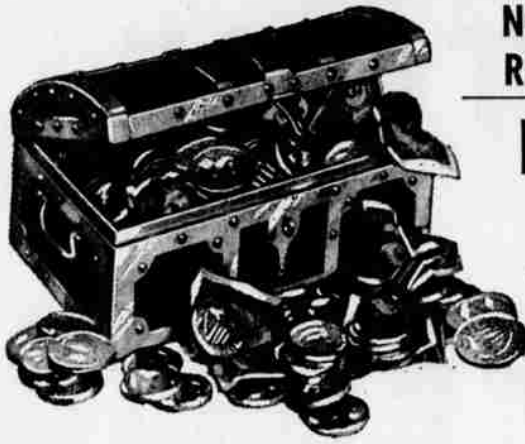
The government already has provided cars for world war II veterans who lost one or both legs above the ankle.
