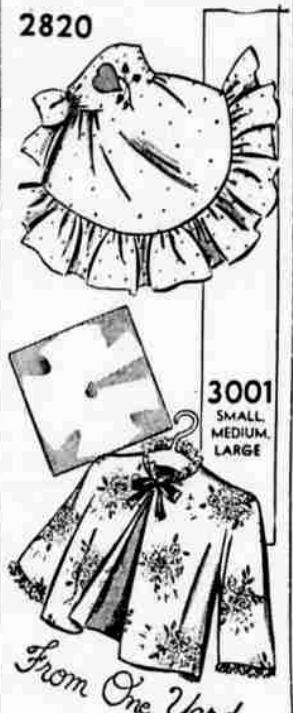
They had reached a turn around on the far side, and here three roads forked west.

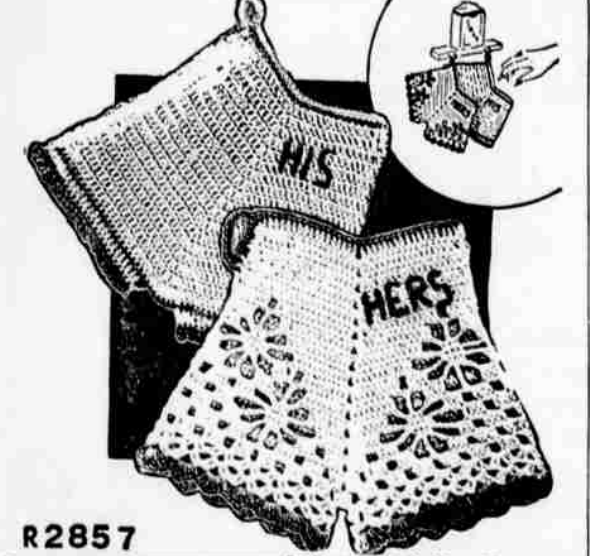

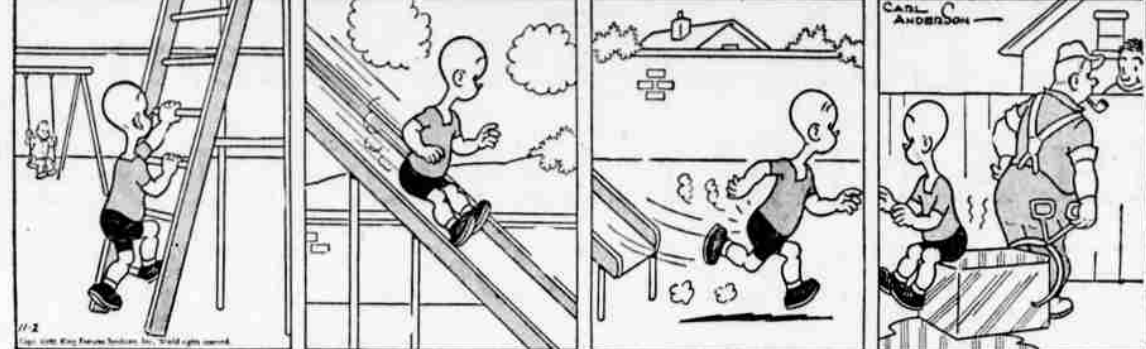
