Washington, Nov. 5 (U.S.—The navy disclosed today it has agreed to give the air force more than three times as many Anapolis graduates next year as it has in past years.
The agreement was hailed immediately in military circles as a big stride forward in unification of the armed forces.
Under the new arrangement, 25 percent of the 690-member graduating class at the U.S. Naval academy may volunteer for transfer to the air force.
