

Pineapple Sweet Potatoes, on the Half Shell Ingredients: 4 small sweet

potatoes (1 pound), 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, ½ nine-ounce can sweetened crushed pineapple not drained (½ cup), ¼ teaspoon salt, 2 teaspoons light

brown sugar, parsley sprigs.

Method: Cut off any small protruding ends of sweet potatoes; scrub with vegetable brush under cold running wat-er; dry well on paper towel. Bake in a moderately hot (400 F.) oven until potatoes are soft when pressed between fingers with a pot holder—about 30 min-utes. Cut carefully in half wise and cut potato shell into mixing bowl; be care-ful to preserve 4 of the half shells for stuffing. Add pineapshells for stuffing. Add pineapple, including juice, salt, and brown sugar, and beat well with a spoon. Pack the mixture firmly into 4 half-shells so that tops are level; now pile remaining potato on top, dividing evenly. Return to oven to reheat, about 10 minutes. Stick a small sprig of parsley in each potato so parsley atem is covered and serve immediately. Makes 4 servings. servings.
