ing more than two months were spurred today with discovery of a scribbled message in a lonely Susitna river cabin 50 miles northwest of here.

The note was found yester-day by Lt. William A. Weed of the Tenth Rescue squadron and Oscar Vogel, a trapper, when they flew to the scene in a heli-they fl they flew to the scene in a helicopter after Vogel noticed on earlier flights that a chimney pipe had been put on the cabin without his knowledge. The cabin is one of a string owned by the trapper.

"Ged bless the man who built this cabin and left food in it. I, Francis Brownfield, was lost and sick and I opened the cabin. If I make it back I will pay the man for the food and shelter."


