## STUDENT FARMER OF DENMARK

"There are so many cars here!"  
And that thought continues to amaze Hans Banke a 22-year-old Danish farm youth who became the first known exchange student farmer to come to the Salem area.  
Banke arrived in the United States during the early summer, and was first assigned to a farm in North Dakota.  
After spending a three-month working visit to C. L. Stanley farm in the North Santiam area near Stayton, he expected to look over other farming areas of the nation.  
The exchange idea which has sent sons of American farmers to Europe and brought many nationalities to this country has been sponsored in the United States by the Farmers Union for goodwill and the valuable interchange of agricultural ideas.  
But the number of automobiles in the United States still remains the first subject Banke thinks of when comparing his homeland to the United States.  
"In Denmark, nearly every body has a bicycle—maybe two. There are so many bicycles. It is hard to drive a car there. But I never imagined there could be so many cars here," he explains.  
The blond and blue-eyed Dane, whose father owns a 125-acre farm near V. Haslage, studied English in college in his native land, and still remains confused by American slang.

On the subject of politics in Denmark, Banke pointed out there were few communists in the little Baltic country although American - Russian friendship during wartime had lulled many into a sympathetic feeling for the Reds.  
"We make fun of them now," Banke explained, telling that post-war experiences had turned the people of his nation to the west.  
The young Dane, far more familiar with farming problems, said that his father raised asparagus, grain and sugar beets. He took a critical view of green American asparagus and told how the crop was bleached during the growing process in Denmark.  
"It tastes better—the green tastes like grass," he asserted.  
Proof that the exchange farming idea can bring usable ideas to this country came when Banke related that sugar beet tops are not discarded in Denmark. Instead, they are chopped and used for ensilage.  
He was impressed with the widespread use of machinery on American farms, but quick to point out that his country had been unable to purchase farm machinery for the better part of a decade.  
A machine designed to pick two rows of potatoes at a time had won his praise in view of the fact that single-row plowing is a style used in Denmark.  
He emphasized, too, that farm buildings are more permanent in Europe than in this country.  
On his father's farm, barns are built of steel and stone. Farm machinery can be rolled onto the concrete second story floor, and in the event of fire, the only losses would be the roof and the contents, the building would stand, he claimed.  
Yet, on a comparison of living standards of the two nations, Banke said there were fewer household utilities such as refrigerators, and that clothing and food were more expensive in Denmark which boasts the highest living standard in Europe.  
He said it was possible to live on 40 cents a day if American money were used in Denmark.  
While at the Stanley farm, Banke will study garden-type agriculture and learn how the produce is marketed to shops in the Salem area.  
He was assigned to the establishment near Stayton on application by the Stanleys to the Farmers Union. For his work there, he will be paid regular wages and live as a member of the family—including the privilege of driving a car.

# Number of Autos Amazes Student Farmer of Denmark

"There are so many cars here!"  
And that thought continues to amaze Hans Banke a 22-year-old Danish farm youth who became the first known exchange student farmer to come to the Salem area.  
Banke arrived in the United States during the early summer, and was first assigned to a farm in North Dakota.  
After spending a three-month working visit to C. L. Stanley farm in the North Santiam area near Stayton, he expected to look over other farming areas of the nation.  
The exchange idea which has sent sons of American farmers to Europe and brought many nationalities to this country has been sponsored in the United States by the Farmers Union for goodwill and the valuable interchange of agricultural ideas.  
But the number of automobiles in the United States still remains the first subject Banke thinks of when comparing his homeland to the United States.  
"In Denmark, nearly every body has a bicycle—maybe two. There are so many bicycles. It is hard to drive a car there. But I never imagined there could be so many cars here," he explains.  
The blond and blue-eyed Dane, whose father owns a 125-acre farm near V. Haslage, studied English in college in his native land, and still remains confused by American slang.

On the subject of politics in Denmark, Banke pointed out there were few communists in the little Baltic country although American - Russian friendship during wartime had lulled many into a sympathetic feeling for the Reds.  
"We make fun of them now," Banke explained, telling that post-war experiences had turned the people of his nation to the west.  
The young Dane, far more familiar with farming problems, said that his father raised asparagus, grain and sugar beets. He took a critical view of green American asparagus and told how the crop was bleached during the growing process in Denmark.  
"It tastes better—the green tastes like grass," he asserted.  
Proof that the exchange farming idea can bring usable ideas to this country came when Banke related that sugar beet tops are not discarded in Denmark. Instead, they are chopped and used for ensilage.  
He was impressed with the widespread use of machinery on American farms, but quick to point out that his country had been unable to purchase farm machinery for the better part of a decade.  
A machine designed to pick two rows of potatoes at a time had won his praise in view of the fact that single-row plowing is a style used in Denmark.  
He emphasized, too, that farm buildings are more permanent in Europe than in this country.  
On his father's farm, barns are built of steel and stone. Farm machinery can be rolled onto the concrete second story floor, and in the event of fire, the only losses would be the roof and the contents, the building would stand, he claimed.  
Yet, on a comparison of living standards of the two nations, Banke said there were fewer household utilities such as refrigerators, and that clothing and food were more expensive in Denmark which boasts the highest living standard in Europe.  
He said it was possible to live on 40 cents a day if American money were used in Denmark.  
While at the Stanley farm, Banke will study garden-type agriculture and learn how the produce is marketed to shops in the Salem area.  
He was assigned to the establishment near Stayton on application by the Stanleys to the Farmers Union. For his work there, he will be paid regular wages and live as a member of the family—including the privilege of driving a car.
