New York, Dec. 16 (AP)—Stock market leadership passed to motion picture issues today after a period of command by rail and oil shares.

The main body of stocks did little or nothing in the way of price movement despite another session of fast trading. Gains and losses were well distributed.

The rate of trading slowed a bit, after three sessions in which volume in each topped 2,000,000 shares. Turnover approached 1,900,000 shares for the full session.

Superior Oil of California was one of the few upsets in the oil section following a three-day advance totaling 60 1/2 points.

The price fell back around 7 points to 211 at one time.

Higher most of the day were Paramount Pictures, Warner, Loews, Sinclair Oil, Amerada Petroleum, Baltimore and Ohio, Douglas Aircraft, Dome Mines, and International Paper.

Losers include Bethlehem Steel, General Motors, Chrysler, Goodrich, Du Pont, General Electric and Phelps Dodge Copper.
