

However, a weight reducing program must be undertaken with precaution and care after a doctor's examination. The kind and quantity of food is usually adjusted by diet to maintain the proper nourishment while eliminating excess fat.

There are satisfying rewards for the person who sticks to the doctor's recommended diet. You will feel better, have a better appearance, and look younger.


