Dividend Checks
Washington, Dec. 29 (IP)—The veterans administration said Wednesday it still does not know when the first of 16,000,000 insurance dividend checks for World War II veterans will be malled.

The target-date of "some time near the middle of January," set last summer, has not been changed despite widespread reports to the contrary, a VA official said.

The same official also said that if the present rate of dividend applications remains constant, it will be more than three years until all

If the present rate of dividend applications remains constant, it will be more than three years until all veterans have applied for their share of the \$2,300,500,000 dividend kitty. At least 1,175,000 veterans have not yet applied, out of an estimated 16,000,000 eligible. Applications are coming into VA's Washington headquarters at the rate of 1,500 a day.

Dividends not applied for will not accumulate interest for the veteran. If a veteran walts three years before asking VA for his dividend check, he will get exactly what he would get if he had been the first to apply. Any interest earned on his dividend will go into the insurance fund as profits.

There is no deadline on applying. The average dividend payment will be \$175.
