"Nope," Hank said. "There's a ranger station there and a ranch. I think probably we can get an auto to drive out from Boise and pick us up."
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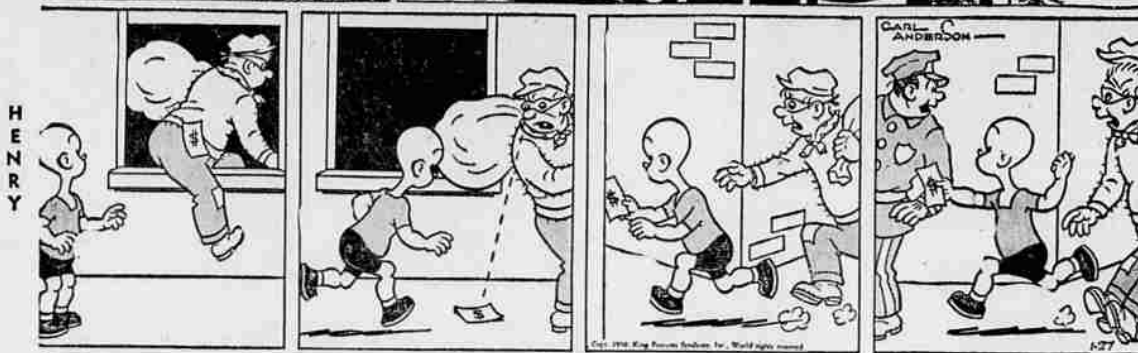
